City of Evanston Construction Notice

Construction for the Morton Grove Niles Water Commission New Water Pump Station and New Water Transmission Mains in Evanston to Begin in mid-June

The Morton Grove Niles Water Commission (MGNWC) is continuing construction on the Water Supply Improvement Project to develop a new water supply system, which will provide residents of Morton Grove and Niles with a new water source and the City of Evanston with additional water revenue.

As part of this project, construction of a new water pump station located on the western portion of 2525 Church St. in Evanston and new water transmission mains running under the North Shore Channel are required to carry water from the City of Evanston through the Village of Skokie and ultimately to the Villages of Morton Grove and Niles.

Construction will take place in defined areas as shown on the project map on the reverse side. Work activity will typically occur Monday through Friday between 7:00 am – 5:30 pm. Occasional work may occur on Saturdays. For safety reasons, the property will remain fenced and gated through the completion of construction.

Pedestrian access to homes will remain open at all times. Parking will only be temporarily impacted when new gas and sewer connections are being installed along McDaniel Avenue. **Residents who are impacted will be notified 48 hours in advance of parking restrictions.**

Construction traffic will only be allowed southbound on McDaniel Avenue by trucks exiting the site from the southern-most property entrance on McDaniel Avenue. Northbound traffic and staging will not be allowed on McDaniel Avenue.
