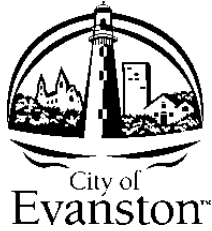

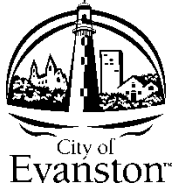

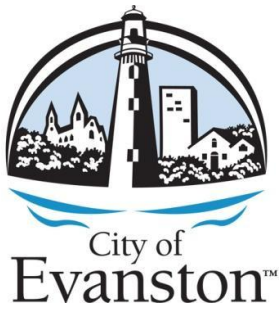

Additional SPC Vehicle Contract Updates – May Cut-Off Dates for 2026 Ford Police Interceptors and Ford Explorers

As previously reported, Currie Fleet has provided the SPC with the following new updates on vehicle production:

- 2026 [Ford Police Interceptor Utility](#) (Contract #204) orders are still being accepted. Production had been expected until June, but we have been notified that the order cut-off date is now May 1. There is a potential 5-month delay for regular gas and eco-boost 2027 models. To bridge the delay, Currie Motors will have gasoline units in stock and available on a first-come, first-served basis. 2027 price list/order forms will be posted on the SPC website as soon as they become available.
- 2026 [Ford Explorer](#) (Contract #231) factory order cut-off date is May 1.
- 2026 [Ford F-150 Police Responder](#) (Contract #232) orders will be honored through the end of model year production. The SPC has requested a 2027 model year rollover on the contract from Ford.

And, as previously reported, Currie Fleet provided the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative (SPC) with the following updates on vehicle production:

- Production of 2026 [Ford Transit Vans](#) (Contract #207) for Full Size Van, Passenger Wagon and E-Transit order acceptance continues until the May 8 factory order cut-off date. Updated price lists/order forms on the SPC Vans page reflect the new order cut-off date.
- The 2027 [Ford Expedition](#) (Contract #233) order bank is open and the updated price lists/order form is on the SPC Sport Utility Vehicles page.
- The anticipated order cut-off date for the 2026 Chevrolet [Silverado Police Pursuit Vehicle](#) (Contract # 234) will likely be late April. The 2027 start-up date is expected to be greatly delayed due to plant retooling.
- Production of the Chevrolet [Silverado 2500](#) (Contract #218) continues, with a factory ordered cut-off expected in late May or early June.
