






- Combined Department Created - 1984





To enhance and protect the health and well-being of all Evanston residents, responding to those who are most vulnerable, at-risk and in crisis.





General Nuisance	bees, wasps, spiders, squirrels, mold, roosters, skunks, cats,








- Coordination with Hospitals, School Districts, University



Public Health Emergency Response H1N1




CDC Priority Groups

- Pregnant women
- Household and caregiver contacts of children < 6 months of age
- Health care and EMS personnel
- Children and young adults
6 m - 24 years
- Persons aged 25 - 64 years who have underlying medical conditions



Implementation of Evanston 2009 H1N1 Clinics



- 10,900 students and 1,600 staff
- 42 Day Care Homes in Evanston
 - 332 children and 42 staff
- 17,000 Students/5,300 Staff at Northwestern University
- Four Group Homes in Skokie
 - 40 Residents and Staff
- 742 Health Care Workers (i.e. not hospital based)
- 4,200 children under the age of 5
- 1,054 pregnant women
- 8,880 high risk individuals with underlying health conditions age 25-64
- 269 First Responders
- 8,000 individuals in the 19 – 24 age group
- 1,480 Parents/Caregivers of High Risk Children



Landlord Tenant Supportive Services

Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP)

- The Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) is a nine-week summer work experience for in-school Evanston youth 14 to 18 years of age.
- The City and local businesses employ SYEP participants to perform a variety of full and part-time tasks to include bank tellers, office assistance, computer/software installation and maintenance, data entry, reception, camp counselors, building maintenance/custodial, painting, food service, and grounds maintenance.
