Deerfield Mayor Harriet Rosenthal Inaugurated as 59th NWMC President; Mount Prospect Wins the Communicopia Award!

Thank you to the one hundred and sixty-one NWMC members and guests who gathered Wednesday at Manzo's Banquets in *Des Plaines* for the 2017 NWMC Gala. Attendees celebrated the accomplishments of outgoing *NWMC President and Des Plaines Mayor Matthew Bogusz* as well as the inauguration of *Deerfield Mayor Harriet Rosenthal* as the 2017-2018 Northwest Municipal Conference President. She is the organization's 59th president and the first from the *Village of Deerfield. Mount Prospect Mayor Arlene Juracek* was installed as Vice-President, while *Morton Grove Village President Dan DiMaria* and *Highland Park City Manager Ghida Neukirch* were installed as Secretary and Treasurer, respectively.

House Special Session Turns Focus to Property Tax Freeze

The General Assembly returned to Springfield this week and are expected to be in session through the end of the month or until a state budget is passed. Today, the House is conducting a Committee of the Whole hearing on a statewide property tax freeze. House Bill 4066 (Rep. Jim Durkin), the latest proposed property tax freeze, proposes to implement a four-year "freeze" of the property tax levy by setting the extension limitation at 0% for levy years 2017 through 2020 unless a higher extension rate is approved by voters via referendum. In addition to freezing the levy, the bill would allow voters to lower the levy via referendum.

The NWMC strongly opposes a property tax freeze. By tying the hands of local elected officials tasked with making sound fiscal decisions for their communities, a freeze severely restricts their ability to fund essential public safety services, escalating public safety pension payments and bond obligations. If voters (via referendum) are given the ability to lower their property taxes, this chaotic facet of the bill would undercut the ability of communities to borrow responsibility and make it virtually impossible to balance budgets and maintain operations in a fiscally responsible manner.

Little progress has been reported on state budget negotiations during the first two days of special session. If a state budget or stopgap appropriation is not enacted by the end of June, our communities will again be faced with various state collected local revenues being withheld. SPC Awards Short-Term Contract Extension with Foster Coach
