## Bikeway Steering Committee Considers Routes

On Wednesday, the steering committee for the Bikeway Feasibility Study met at the *Barrington Village Hall*. This study, funded by the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) Local Technical Assistance (LTA) program, seeks to identify bicycle corridors connecting the Crabtree Forest Preserve with the Fox River Trail.

The project consultants presented the committee with the quantitative and qualitative scores of five previously identified corridors, recommending the top three scoring routes for further analysis. The committee also discussed the estimated cost of proposed on-street and off-street facilities. A public meeting on the three proposed routes will be held in early May, with the time and location to be determined. #### Niles Demonstrates Electric Public Services Vehicle

The NWMC Environmental Best Practices Committee met on Wednesday at the *Niles Public Services Building* and took an up-close look at the village& first 100 percent electrically-powered vehicle, a new cargo van. The van, which was purchased in February, will be used by the Department of Public Services to store and transport tools and other equipment. Public Services staff explained the anticipated fuel and maintenance costs savings with the electric vehicle over a traditional gasoline-powered one and also discussed other technical aspects including the charging time and battery life. The vehicle was paid for in part by a grant from the Clean Drive Chicago program. # Federal Specification Changes May Lead to SPC Ambulance Cost Increases

The Suburban Purchasing Cooperative (SPC) has been informed by the SPC ambulance program vendor of potential cost increases related to changes in federal procurement specifications governing ambulances. Foster Coach Sales has notified staff that proposed changes, primarily to cot retention systems on KKK-1822 Federal Procurement Specifications (to which Illinois adheres), may be implemented effective July 1, which will add considerable cost to any ambulance ordered after July 1, 2015.

SPC Contract #133 for Horton 623 Type I Additional Duty Ambulance and other optional models is held by Foster Coach Sales of Sterling, IL. Foster has advised that the specification changes could increase the cost of each unit up to \$22,000. Stryker is currently working on a less expensive fastening system that may be in the \$5,000 range, but it will not be available until late this year. # May 1 Deadline for Projects on MWRD Existing Development Plans List

The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO) allows the District to compile an Existing Development Plans List (grandfathered projects) for proposed developments that have received preliminary approval from a municipality. All developments included on the list are subject to the Legacy Sewer Permit Ordinance; however, a complete permit application for each development must be submitted by next Friday, May 1.

Projects that require a Sewerage System Permit must complete construction within the three (3) year time period as allowed under the conditions of the approved permit.
