#### Transportation Committee Hears Bold Transit and Rail Plans

The NWMC Transportation Committee met on Thursday and received presentations regarding the future of mass transit and high speed rail. Center for Neighborhood Technology Vice President of Policy Jacky Grimshaw discussed the organization's Transit Future campaign. The campaign is aimed at raising bondable capital funding through a menu of increased taxes to finance up to \$20 billion in currently unfunded transit projects. Their initial proposal only covers Cook County, with a long term goal of raising funds and constructing projects region wide. While recognizing the need for better links between population and jobs centers, the Transportation Committee requested more information on projected costs and potential sources of revenue before recommending a position on the campaign. The committee and staff also raised concerns with building new projects given the capital needs of the current system.

Midwest High Speed Rail Association Executive Director Rick Harnish discussed the proposed Crossrail Chicago project, which would provide a high-speed rail link from McCormick Place, through Union Station to O'Hare airport and connect a network of high-speed rail lines. It would also allow for new cross-town commuter trains linking the south suburbs to the northwest suburbs.
