North Shore Technical Committee Approves STP Changes, Talks Future Programming

On Wednesday, the North Shore Council of Mayors Technical Committee met to approve Surface Transportation Program (STP) modifications and discuss future programming of STP funds. The committee approved a minor cost increase for the *Lincolnwood* led Central Avenue and Pratt Avenue intersection

improvement project, which is a joint project with *Skokie* and Chicago. This project will begin construction later this year. Additionally, the committee approved a reprogramming request from the *Village of Glenview*, which removes the Techny Trail projects from the current program and replaces them with four resurfacing projects from the 2012 call for projects.

Next, the committee turned its attention to future STP programming. The North Shore Council will end federal fiscal year (FFY) 2014 with a positive STP balance. Additionally, the Chicago region has done a poor job spending STP funds in FFY 2014, thus providing an opportunity to access unspent funds. Given these factors and since it has been two years since the last call for projects, the Technical Committee agreed to hold a call for new STP projects. In order to allow time for local planning and prioritizing, the next call for projects from the North Shore Council is tentatively scheduled to take place in December of this year. The programming of new projects would occur in early 2015. The Technical Committee believes that the regional STP circumstances will enable the North Shore Council to move regionally significant projects forward.

Finally, the committee heard a report from Maria Choca Urban of Cook County on the county's Long Range Transportation Plan. She provided an overview of the planning process and the recently completed multimodal corridor analysis. MMC Announces RFP for Energy Efficient Funding

From the Desk of Metropolitan Mayors Caucus Environmental Initiatives Coordinator Jeffrey Walter:

The Metropolitan Mayors Caucus (MMC) Public Sector Energy Efficiency Program (PSEE), in partnership with 360 Energy Group, provides funding and technical assistance to help local governments update and retrofit public facilities to improve energy efficiency and save money. Municipalities, park districts, libraries, schools, townships, and other local governments throughout the Com Ed, People's Gas, North Shore Gas and Nicor service areas are invited to participate.

Grant reimbursements can be up to \$300,000 per facility location for projects including boiler and chiller replacements, HVAC system tune-ups, indoor and outdoor lighting upgrades, heat distribution system upgrades, pipe insulation, and more. Projects result in energy and cost savings, and have an average payback of 3.49 years. Select HVAC system maintenance and upgrade projects may also be completed at no direct cost to the public agency. Funding for this program is provided by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) Illinois Energy Now program.

Project Proposal Forms for indoor and outdoor lighting projects are due July 30, 2014 in order to be eligible for supplemental funding through the Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation that may fund up to 100% of project costs when coupled with PSEE grant reimbursements. 360 Energy Group will provide direct grant application assistance to help public agencies take advantage of all state and private funding available to pay for energy efficiency improvements.

Project Proposal Forms for all energy efficiency projects are due September 1, 2014. If you need assistance planning your project, the program includes free technical assistance from 360 Energy Group at no cost to Public Agencies.

All project completed by <u>October 31, 2014</u> are eligible for a 10% "sweet deal" bonus.
