Subject: Publication of FY2014 Annual Treasurer's Report
Date: July 21, 2015

Pursuant to Illinois Compiled Statutes Chapter 65, Section 5/3.1-35-65, the City Treasurer is required to annually prepare and file with the City Clerk and County Collector an account of monies received and expenditure incurred during the preceding fiscal year, within six months after the end of each fiscal year. For the year ending December 31, 2014 the City requested and was granted a 30 day extension. The City Clerk is required to publish the annual report in a local newspaper having general circulation in the City.

The Treasurer's Report is required to include the following information:

- All monies received by the municipality
- All monies paid out where the total amount paid during the fiscal year exceeds \$2,500 in the aggregate with the name of the persons
- All monies paid out by the municipality as compensation for personal services with the name of persons listing them in one of several amount categories
- A summary statement of operations for all funds

Accordingly, all of the above information is posted on the City's website at: <u>http://cityofevanston.org/city-budget/financial-reports/</u>. The City of Evanston Treasurer's Report will be published in the Pioneer Press on Thursday August 6th.

### Mayor Tisdahl Provides Testimony on Governor's Pension Reform Proposal

*Evanston Mayor (and past NWMC President) Elizabeth Tisdahl* provided testimony to the House Personnel and Pension Committee during their July 21 hearing on Governor Rauner's proposed pension reform package. This hearing was conducted specifically to discuss the public safety pension elements of the Governor's proposal. The Governor's proposal includes a shift for Tier 1 employees to either a reduced annual cost of living adjustment or the loss of ability to count future salary increases toward their final pension; creation of a Tier 3 pension level for new employees that would be a hybrid defined benefit/defined contribution pension; a fifteen year extension of the deadline to meet the 90% funding requirement; defining catastrophic injury in the Public Safety Employee Benefit Act (PSEBA); consolidation of the individual pension fund assets into the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund for investment purposes; redefining what is allowed under collective bargaining; and, allowing for municipalities to declare bankruptcy.

Mayor Tisdahl highlighted the extraordinary effort Evanston has undertaken to address their pension funding situation. This effort included exceeding the required actuarially required contributions into their funds by \$16 million over the past four years, which increased the funding levels from approximately 40% to 50% funded.

On behalf of the Pension Fairness for Illinois Communities Coalition, Mayor Tisdahl stated support for the consolidation of the pension funds but noted that additional economies of scale could be achieve by pursuing a more extensive consolidation of operations; that many communities could benefit from the extension of the funding deadline but that it could raise issues with accounting best practices; and, support for clarifying the PSEBA catastrophic injury definition. She also noted that since neither the Tier 1 change or the proposed Tier 3 benefit have been actuarially tested that it was impossible to offer an informed opinion as to the extent of any taxpayer relief these may produce. Mayor Tisdahl reiterated the Pension Fairness Coalition's desire to work on solutions that provide retirement security for public safety personnel while reducing the burden on taxpayers. Mayor Tisdahl was assisted by *Evanston City Manager Wally Bobkiewicz* and *NWMC Deputy Director Larry Bury* in responding to committee member questions.

### Property Tax Freeze Remains Part of Springfield Conversation

Last week, the Illinois Senate considered the latest in a growing list of property tax freeze proposals. Senate Bill 316, sponsored by Senate President Cullerton, fell just short of the three-fifths majority necessary for approval. Senate Republicans voted present on the bill noting the absence of collective bargaining and prevailing wage reforms as pushed by Governor Rauner. In a press conference on Wednesday, Senator Cullerton indicated that he plans to again bring a property tax freeze for a vote in the Senate.

As amended, Senate Bill 316 would freeze the property tax extensions for levy years 2016-2017 for local governments outside Cook County and 2017-2018 in Cook County unless a higher extension is approved via referendum. The amendment would make all taxing districts, including home rule units of local government, subject to the Property Tax Extension Limitation Law (PTELL) and set the extension limitation at zero percent in the years specified above. The bill did include an exemption from the limit for public safety purposes. Additionally, the bill contained provisions for school funding reform and pension funding provisions for the Chicago Public Schools.

Governor Rauner has been advocating for a property tax freeze since before he was elected, and it has been a major component of his Turnaround Agenda. Republicans, who have voiced support for a property tax freeze, have voted present on various property tax freeze bills in both the House and the Senate arguing that that these bills have failed to address the local control issues of collective bargaining and prevailing wage.

The NWMC continues to remain opposed to any property tax freeze due to it taking revenue options out of the hands of those officials elected by local voters to make these decisions on behalf of their communities. ### SPC Extends 2016 Chevy Tahoe Police Pursuit Vehicle Contract with Price Increase

The SPC Governing Board has approved the first of three (3) possible one-year contract extensions on the 2016 Chevrolet Tahoe Patrol Package (Contract #147) with Currie Motors Chevrolet in Forest Park. The extension runs through April 10, 2016. General Motors has increased the 2016 base price of the Chevy Tahoe, which has been extremely popular with SPC members, by \$5,325.49, from \$27,608.00 to \$32,933.49. General Motors had two price increases on the Chevy Tahoe that the SPC was able to bypass during first year of the award due to the 12-month pricing guarantee in the terms of our contract. The 2016 increase is based on three factors:
