

Fleetwood-Jourdain Community Center Accessibility

Date: August 6, 2014

The City Council recently requested an update on the accessibility of the Fleetwood Jourdain center.

Fleetwood has two public entrances, one located on the east façade adjacent to the parking lot and a second located on the south facade along Foster Street. Both entrances meet applicable code related to ADA accessibility.

East Entrance: This entrance contains two parking spaces clearly marked for accessible parking including required signs displaying the international graphic symbol of a wheelchair bound person. A curb ramp is provided from the parking lot to access the sidewalk leading to the building entrance. The entrance doorway is flush with adjacent grade. At the entrance door a push pad is provided to operate the door. The door threshold has beyeled ends to ease wheelchairs over the threshold.

South Entrance: This entrance includes a wide depressed curb at Foster Street for easy drop off and wheelchair access. A level sidewalk leads to the building's entrance door. A push pad is provided on the right wall close to the entrance doors. The threshold for this door is approximately 1/4" high, meeting accessibility requirements. The interior set of doors is always left in the open position when Fleetwood is open.

In response to the comment regarding the availability of wheelchairs, Fleetwood has three wheelchairs available for use for patrons that have a need. The wheelchairs are provided on a first come, first request basis. The provision of wheelchairs is a courtesy that not many recreation centers offer. Finally with regards to the circular drive, the removal of the drive provided additional outdoor seating and green space to the center.
