EPA Issues FY 2015 Brownfields Planning Grant Request for Proposals

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has announced the availability of funding to eligible entities who wish to develop an area-wide plan for brownfields assessment, cleanup and subsequent reuse. This funding is for research, technical assistance and/or training activities directed to one or more brownfield sites. Each project funded under this grant must result in an area-wide plan which includes specific implementation strategies for assessing, cleaning up and reusing the brownfields site(s) as well as related brownfields and project area revitalization strategies. The EPA anticipates awarding approximately 20 projects in total, funded at up to \$200,000 each. Please note that applicants who received a brownfield area-wide planning grants from the EPA in Fiscal Year 2010 or 2013 (FY10 or FY13) are not eligible to apply under this competition.

Northeastern Illinois was recently named an "Investing in Manufacturing Communities Partnership" community by the U.S. Department of Commerce; therefore, grant proposals from the region that support manufacturing will receive additional consideration by the EPA. The proposal submission deadline is Monday, September 22, 2014. Lower Des Plaines River Watershed Planning Council Update

On Thursday, the Lower Des Plaines River Watershed Planning Council met and discussed acquisition of flood prone properties, training opportunities under the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD) Watershed Management Ordinance (WMO) and the inflow/infiltration program. MWRD staff announced that the District now has statutory authority to pursue local stormwater projects as a result of recent legislation. Public Act 98-0652, signed into law on June 18, 2014, amends the District's statutory authority to allow for acquisition of flood-prone properties and to plan, implement, finance and operate local stormwater management projects. Accordingly, it was necessary to amend the Cook County Stormwater Management Plan (CCSMP) to be consistent with the new law. The MWRD Board of Commissioners adopted the updated CCSMP on July 10. Additionally, the MWRD Board recently adopted policies for acquisition of flood-prone properties. The District will soon reach out to municipalities regarding partnering opportunities in the acquisition of flood-prone properties. While the District has no immediate plans for soliciting more local flood control projects, municipalities can submit candidate projects for future consideration on an ongoing basis.

The MWRD continues to offer training opportunities to better understand the Watershed Management Ordinance, which became effective on May 1. On Thursday, August 21, the District will conduct HEC-HMS hydrologic modeling training for municipal and consulting engineers. Similar sessions will be held on Thursday, August 28 and Wednesday, September 3. The workshops will be hands-on computer trainings that will introduce course participants to HEC-HMS and how to use the program for typical WMO submittals. The morning session (8:00 a.m. – noon) will be dedicated to HEC-HMS training, with the workshop wrapping up over lunch (which will be provided). Following the training, an optional tour of the Stickney Water Reclamation Plant will be provided to attendees. The duration of the tour is approximately two hours and will conclude at 3:00 p.m. There is no registration fee for this workshop and Professional Development Hours will be provided. Finally, MWRD staff informed the council that the MWRD Board amended the WMO to include the new inflow and infiltration removal program.
