### SPC Obtains Lower Option Pricing on the 2016 Dodge Charger Police Pursuit Vehicle

# MPC Offers Infrastructure Project Evaluation Using Alternative Financing

From the Desk of Metropolitan Planning Council Executive Vice President Peter Skosey:

The Metropolitan Planning Council (MPC) is leading an effort to identify proposed infrastructure capital improvement projects to conduct a comparison between traditional and alternative financing options. Infrastructure projects could include a court house, police/fire station, village hall, recreational facility, water service infrastructure, etc. that are being planned for in Northeastern Illinois by a government entity. Led by financing experts, the selected project will serve as a test demonstration to explore the potential viability of alternative financing options for delivering necessary infrastructure.

The evaluation will include what the potential costs and benefits might be for using an alternative finance and delivery method such as—public private partnerships, value capture, aggregating projects across municipalities and streamlining RPFs and vendors—compared with a traditional delivery method over the projects full lifecycle. There is no fee to participate, nor obligation to carry out the results of the pilot on the part of the selected community. This is only a test analysis to see how alternative financing compares with traditional financing for capital improvement projects in our region.
