- Summer camp spots are filling up quickly! We already have many camp sections full with waitlists.
- The Ecology Center will host a food policy forum for State Representative Gabel on Sunday, March 30th. The forum will discuss the Illinois council on food, farms and jobs. They will be working on ideas, recommendations and resolutions to help work with community farmer markets to help promote local farms and jobs. The forum will be held from 12pm-2pm.
- This month's Produce Mobile at Robert Crown had approximately 365 participants who signed in and received an abundance of dry goods, fresh vegetables, and fruits. For the first time the City provided transportation for seniors to and from the event which turned out to be a huge success. We are currently looking into repeating this effort again for the next Produce Mobile event which is Tuesday, April 8, 9:30am to 11:30am.
- Save the Date for the third annual Evanston Green Ball Friday, May 30, 2014 from 7pm to 10pm at the Levy Senior Center, 300 Dodge Ave.
- Thirty-eight new vendor applications were sent out to interested parties looking to get into the 2014 Downtown Evanston Farmers' Market. Thirteen applications were returned by the due date. Selection will take place on Monday, March 24th 7-9pm with members from the Friends of the Evanston Farmers' Market group. We currently have about 4 spaces available for the upcoming season. Marketing of the market will begin in April. Home Grown Artists will be able to reserve space at the market starting in April. The applications will be available on the market website.
- Spring programs start next week for the Evanston Ecology Center! We have some great new programs this spring including Spring Seedlings, Squirrel Tales and Backyard Habitats. Summer camp spots are filling up quickly!

The Evanston Ecology Center, in collaboration with Burt's Bees and the Pollinator Partnership, is hoping to increase habitats available for pollinators, such as birds, bees and butterflies this spring at the Ladd Arboretum, 2024 McCormick Blvd. From now until April, Burt's Bees will donate five plants to the Ecology Center for every Burt's Bees Lip Balm purchased from the Net Zero Walgreens located at 635 Chicago Ave. The Ecology Center aims to fulfill its goal of providing 5,000 new plants to continue community education and awareness, as well as providing thriving habitats. Maintaining a healthy environment for pollinators is vital as they contribute to the reproduction of 80 percent of all flowering plants worldwide. Pollinators also provide us with one in every three bites of food we consume. Pollination from honey bees alone contributes \$8 to \$10 billion annually to the U.S. economy. Contributions received from this campaign will be commemorated with a planting day in the spring. Dates will be announced soon.



# WEEK ENDING MARCH 14, 2014

## NWMC Board Approves Legislative Positions – Act NOW on House Bill 5485

Thank you to the twenty-nine NWMC members who attended Wednesday night's board meeting. The membership approved positions on ninety-one (91) pieces of legislation introduced in the General Assembly so far that affect local governments. One of the bills previously opposed by the Conference, <u>House Bill 5485</u>, received special attention this week. Sponsored by Representative Rita Mayfield (D-Waukegan) the legislation makes fire department manning levels a mandatory subject of collective bargaining and is currently on second reading in the House. NWMC staff emailed a reminder today strongly urging our membership to contact their representatives and request that they **OPPOSE** House Bill 5485.

In other Board action, the membership unanimously approved the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus 2014 Legislative Priorities. The Caucus priorities closely mirror the NWMC 2014 Legislative Program initiatives, including pension reform for current public safety employees and protection of local government revenues. Finally, the Board approved contract renewals for the NWMC Employee Assistance Program and Surplus Vehicle and Equipment Auction program. *Staff contacts: Mark Fowler, Larry Bury* 

#### Still Time to Register for NWMC Legislative Days

As noted above, legislation affecting local government continues to move through the process in Springfield, making attendance at this year's NWMC Legislative Days more critical than ever. Currently, thirty-three members and staff will meet on Tuesday, March 25, 2:00 p.m. at the Illinois Municipal League offices for a briefing of the issues/events for the week and legislation being monitored by the Conference. From there, members will head to the Capitol for committee hearings and then to the Sangamo Club for our annual informal dinner with our legislators.

Wednesday, March 26 will begin with committee hearings and lobbying in the capitol with a midday break to hear Governor Quinn deliver his budget address. The remainder of the day as well as Thursday, March 27 will be spent talking to our legislators about the governor's address and providing input on other legislation in advance of Friday's deadline to advance bills out of committee.

#### MWRD Seeks Existing Developments List for Watershed Management Ordinance

Last month, the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) sent a letter to local governments requesting that they submit a list of proposed developments to be grandfathered under the current sewer permit requirements. This list must comprise of developments that have received preliminary approval from a governing municipality in order to be exempt from the requirements of the Watershed Management Ordinance, which becomes effective May 1. Developments must submit a complete permit application by May 1, 2015 in order to remain on the existing developments list.

Municipalities must submit a form with preliminary site plans and written proof of preliminary approval to the MWRD by May 1. Please note that no additional developments will be added after that date. ### IDNR Publishes Lake Michigan Water Allocation Rules Changes

On Friday, March 7, the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) published proposed changes to the Rules and Regulations for the Allocation of Water from Lake Michigan (IL Admin. Code, Title 17, Part 3730). This first notice begins a 45 day review and comment period after which IDNR will address all comments received and provide these to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR). A second notice will be published in the Illinois Register that includes the comments received and the Department response, along with a date that JCAR will meet to consider the proposed Rules.

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Below please find a brief summary of the substantive changes IDNR made based on NWMC staff review and consideration of the comments received from the initial public outreach in 2013:

- The Unaccounted-For-Flow Standard will be replaced with a Non-Revenue Water Standard (12% in 2015, decreasing to 10% by 2019).
- Water systems not in compliance with the non-revenue standard will be required to prepare and submit a water system improvement plan.
- Sub-metering will be recommended, rather than required.
