Attorney General Ruling Opens Employee Personal Emails to FOIA

In response to a dispute over public access to Chicago Police Department (CPD) emails, last week the Illinois Attorney General issued a binding opinion that could have far reaching implications for local governments and their employees.

A Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request was issued to the CPD for all emails related to the Laquan McDonald case. The CPD turned over requested email records in its possession but argued that under FOIA the emails of CPD employees contained on their own private email accounts were not public records. On August 9, the Attorney General issued a binding opinion (<u>link to FOIA opinion 16-006</u>) that directed the CPD "to take immediate and appropriate action to comply with this opinion by conducting a search of the personal e-mail accounts of the 12 named CPD officers." The ruling also states that "CPD's interpretation would undercut the principle that public bodies act through their employees, by excluding from the definition of "public records" communications sent or received by employees of a public body on personal devices or accounts, regardless of whether the communications pertain to the transaction of public business. Such an interpretation erroneously focuses not on the content of a communication but on the method by which it is transmitted."

America's AA Announces New Transportation Rates, Discusses Program Expansion

As we have been reporting, the next NWMC live Surplus Vehicle and Equipment Auction will be held on Tuesday, October 25, 1:00 p.m. at Americas Auto Auction (America's AA) Chicago, 14001 S. Karlov Avenue in Crestwood. Staff met with representatives from America's AA this morning to discuss the auction as well as an initiative to expand the program by including other councils of government (COGs) in the region and establishing a quarterly auction schedule.

During the meeting, America's AA reported that they have implemented a new, simplified and transparent transportation fee to deliver vehicles to their Crestwood facility. The new rate is \$1.50 per mile based on mileage calculated by Google Maps from the exact pickup location to delivery at America's AA. Charges are one-way only, with a \$35.00 minimum.

We are working to make the event even bigger and better by joining forces with some of the other COGs in the region. We will keep you posted as we finalize participation which will create additional excitement, larger crowds and more vehicles. Bicycle and Pedestrian Committee Discusses Priorities, Plans and Grants

The NWMC Bicycle and Pedestrian Committee met on Tuesday to consider potential meeting topics and committee priorities for the upcoming year. The committee expressed a desire to learn more about pedestrian crossing options, particularly along 4-lane roads, as well as community bike share programs. Recently, several communities in the region have begun implementing bike share systems. The committee plans to explore the challenges and opportunities involved in implementing such a system in a suburban context. NWMC staff announced plans to update the 2010 NWMC Bike Plan and the committee identified items they would like the update to address.

NWMC staff also presented grant opportunities for bicycle and pedestrian projects. The Regional Transit Authority (RTA) Access to Transit Improvement Program is currently accepting applications until October 30. In January, the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) will open a call for Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) and Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) projects. The CMAQ and TAP applications will require Phase I Engineering to be underway at the time of application.
