NWMC Appoints Neukirch as Treasurer; Approves 2017 Legislative Program

Thank you to the twenty-six NWMC members who braved the elements to attend Wednesday night's board meeting. The membership unanimously approved the Nominating Committee and Executive Board's recommendation to appoint *Highland Park City Manager Ghida Neukirch* as the NWMC Treasurer. We thank her and look forward to working with Ghida in her new capacity.

The membership also unanimously approved the 2017 NWMC Legislative Program, which will be presented to legislators at the January 21 NWMC Legislative Brunch (see article below). Staff provided an update to the membership on the General Assembly's "lame duck" session as well as legislation already introduced by the 100th General Assembly, which took office on Wednesday. Finally, the board approved a recommendation to conduct the NWMC's annual Legislative Days in Springfield on March 14-16, which is the deadline week in the Senate to approve legislation in committee. *Staff contacts: Mark Fowler, Larry Bury*

Out With the Old, In With the New (General Assembly)

The 100th General Assembly took office on Wednesday facing an immediate challenge to address the state's budget impasse that carried over from the 99th General Assembly. Following the expiration of the state's stopgap budget on December 31, Senate President Cullerton and Minority Leader Radogno introduced a bipartisan budget package on Monday. Although the bills were not assigned to committees for formal hearings, they were reintroduced on Wednesday as Senate Bills 1 through 13 and are expected to receive committee hearings when the General Assembly returns to session on Tuesday, January 24. Included in the package were bills covering local government consolidation (Senate Bill 3), expanded gaming (Senate Bill 7), workers' compensation reforms (Senate Bill 12) and a two-year property tax freeze (Senate Bill 13).

On Tuesday and prior to the end of the 99th General Assembly, the House approved a permanent property tax freeze in the form of House Bill 6630. The vote was largely symbolic as the bill was not intended to advance further due to insufficient time to advance the bill in the Senate. On the positive side, the 99th General Assembly approved Senate Bill 550, which provides for testing of school facilities for lead in water. The final version did not impose the cost of testing on municipal water suppliers as originally proposed. Instead, the cost of testing will come from school life, health and safety funds, with a provision that the school districts can work with their municipalities to complete the testing. Finally, the EDGE economic development tax credit program was extended through April 30. *Staff contacts: Mark Fowler, Larry Bury, Chris Staron*

The first quarterly live NWMC Surplus Vehicle and Equipment Auction for 2017 will be held on Tuesday, January 24, 1:00 p.m., at America's Auto Auction (America's AA) in Crestwood. Please visit

http://municipality.auction/ for details on the upcoming auction (including the run list), photos from the October 25 event or more information on America's Auto Auction. To date, 3 NWMC members, *Evanston, Lincolnshire* and *Skokie* have confirmed participation, along with Ford City, Village of Montgomery, West Dundee and Yorkville. Please note that there is still time to turn your clunkers into cash. While America's AA will take vehicles up until the day of the auction, we recommend that you submit your vehicles by Friday, January 20 so that potential buyers can preview them on the website.

Other live auction dates for 2017 are: Tuesday, April 25; Tuesday, July 25; and, Tuesday, October 24. The NWMC agreement with America's AA also provides for year round Internet sales, so participants do not have to wait for one of the quarterly live sales in order to dispose of surplus vehicles and equipment.
