Coalition Offers Initial Guidance for Small Cell Deployment Requests

As the public's appetite for access to mobile communications and data continues to grow rapidly, current wireless infrastructure is struggling to handle the demand. Cellular carriers are seeking to implement new technology and equipment to meet customer expectations in locations where demand is exceeding current capacity. Over the past several months, cellular carriers and/or their agents have noticeably increased the number of requests for local governments to approve the deployment of new wireless communication facilities.

The majority of these requests are taking two forms:

- Requests from cellular carriers (such as AT&T, Verizon, etc.) to deploy "small cell" equipment on existing structures or facilities (such as telephone poles); and,
- Requests from recent entrants into the market (such as Mobilitie) to construct new infrastructure that will serve as locations for carriers to deploy their equipment.

NWMC members, working with officials from the DuPage Mayors and Managers Conference (DMMC) and West Central Municipal Conference, are preparing guidance to help smooth the introduction of this new infrastructure into our communities. The group's discussions have focused on gaining a better understanding of this rapidly changing industry and reviewing options for using local regulations (right-of-way and/or zoning ordinances) to manage these requests and ensure these deployments are a proper fit within each community. The group is working to prepare specific recommendations which we expect to make available in the near future.

Emerging from this process were two additional items forwarded to members this week. One, prepared by Victor Filippini (Filippini Law Firm), provides some initial steps that local governments can utilize when receiving these requests. The second was an invitation to an informational workshop on this topic hosted by DMMC on Monday, August 29. That workshop is designed to gain a better understanding of this changing technology and examples of how to respond to these requests.
