See You Next Week!

On Wednesday, the NWMC Executive Board met to set the agenda for next week's membership meeting. The NWMC Board of Directors will meet on Wednesday, February 8, 7:00 p.m. in Room 1625 of Oakton Community College in *Des Plaines*. Highlighting the agenda will be an update on the state budget impasse and ongoing threats to local government revenues as well as legislation introduced in the 100th General Assembly that impacts local governments. The board will also consider recommendations to approve the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus 2017 legislative priorities and to encourage the NWMC congressional delegation to join the Congressional Municipal Finance Caucus, which seeks to protect the federal tax exempt status of municipal bonds. Finally, the board will receive an update on proposed changes to the regional sub allocation of federal surface transportation funds. March is a Great Time to be in Springfield!

This morning, staff emailed the announcement and registration form for NWMC Legislative Days in Springfield, scheduled for Tuesday, March 14 through Thursday March 16. As stated in the email, "The state continues without a complete budget, and Illinois' fiscal problems continue to mount. In the absence of a budget, local governments will again need to fight to ensure the timely distribution of critical local revenues (Use Tax, Motor Fuel Tax, gaming revenues and wireless 9-1-1 surcharges). As lawmakers grapple with the tough decisions necessary to pass a balanced budget, cuts to local government funding and a property tax freeze are very much on the table. A recent budget proposal from the Illinois Policy Institute recommends a complete cut of the Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) based on their view that LGDF is a state "subsidy" that pays for "excessive local perks and expenses." Your presence in Springfield is imperative for crafting an accurate narrative for local legislators. So much is at stake for the future of our communities."

Staff is working to finalize the exact schedule of events. When we have a more concrete schedule of legislative committee hearings and key legislator meetings, we will send out additional details. Meanwhile, here is a preliminary schedule of events:
