Attached please find the monthly Minority Women's Evanston Business Enterprise (MWEBE) and Local Employment Program (LEP) Compliance tracking report which is presented to the MWEBE Committee. This report tracks Bids and RFPs that can potentially have an MWEBE (25% goal) or LEP (15% requirement) component on a monthly basis. The final page also shows waivers that are granted and the rationale for those waivers.

The committee also approved a motion calling on the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) to incorporate the Conference's recommendations in the draft Memorandum of Understanding which will guide the future allocation of Surface Transportation Program (STP) funding in the region. *Staff contacts: Mike Walczak, Brian Pigeon*

North Shore Council Approves Changes for New Fiscal Year, Discusses STP Changes

On Wednesday, the North Shore Council of Mayors Technical Committee met at the *Skokie Village Hall* and approved a number of changes to the Council's Surface Transportation Program (STP) in preparation for the rollover of the federal fiscal year. Staff from the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) discussed ongoing negotiations to change the way STP funds are allocated in the region and the impact that might have on North Shore Council projects. At the request of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), CMAP is moving from a population-based allocation model to one based on performance measures.

NWMC staff also briefed the committee on the status of the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) call for projects and announced that the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) will open a call for projects for the Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) beginning on October 2. Additionally, the committee approved a recommendation to appoint *Glencoe Village President Lawrence Levin* as the North Shore Council's representative to the Council of Mayors Executive Committee. The Executive Committee serves as a link between the suburban councils and CMAP providing municipal input regarding planning decisions. *Staff contact: Brian Pigeon*

Northwest Council Technical Committee Plans for STP Changes

The Northwest Council of Mayors Technical Committee met this morning at the *Barrington Village Hall* and recommended significant changes in the council's 2018-2020 program to best position the council during the region's transition to the new STP programming and distribution rules. The committee recommended a reprioritization of the program after FY 2018 to take advantage of any available STP funds. All lighting projects and projects unlikely to progress before 2020 were removed from the program. The committee also discussed future strategies for the planned shared regional fund starting in 2020. *Staff contact: Mike Walczak*

Learn About "The Future of Rail Freight Traffic"

On Wednesday, October 11, NWMC members *Bannockburn, Deerfield, Glenview, Lake Forest* and *Northbrook* are hosting a free symposium to discuss The Future of Rail Freight Traffic. The event will be held from 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at Trinity University's Waybright Center, Melton Hall, 2065 Half Day Road in *Bannockburn*. The program is open to the public and interested members of all involved communities are invited to attend.

The topic of freight being transported by local rail lines has generated increasing attention in these and other Chicago area communities. The operation of area freight yards, discussions on a freight-dedicated bypass rail line and more recently potential freight train impacts related to improvements outlined in the Chicago-Milwaukee Intercity Passenger Rail Corridor Environmental Assessment have raised concerns and questions by many residents living within proximity to rail infrastructure.

Issues to be addressed include: current freight issues; cargo currently being transported; safety; and, what the Chicagoland area can expect in the future. A short presentation, followed by a Q & A session, will be moderated by Joseph P. Schwieterman, Ph.D., School of Public Service and Director of the Chaddick Institute

for Metropolitan Development at DePaul University. Panelists include: Mark Walbrun PE, with engineering firm Mott MacDonald and who is current chair of the Transportation Research Board committee on Shared Rail Corridors; Laura Wilkison, Executive Vice President of Metro Strategies, who has worked on the region's CREATE rail plan; and, Audrey Wennink, who leads the Regional Planning & Infrastructure Advisory Committee and is the Transportation Director at the Metropolitan Planning Council. *Staff contacts: Mike Walczak, Brian Pigeon*

Truck Route Upgrade Funding Available Through IDOT

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) is currently accepting applications for the Truck Access Route Program (TARP). Applications are due to the IDOT District One Local Roads and Streets office by Friday, November 3, with project award notifications expected to be announced the week of November 27.

Only roadway sections determined to be eligible for upgrading to a designated truck route will be funded from the program (unless phased construction is approved). Eligible routes must terminate at a designated truck route or municipal border and begin at a truck generator, another designated truck route, or a municipal border. Roadway sections that were previously upgraded with TARP funds are not eligible for funding from this program. TARP funds cannot be used for pavement preservation or maintenance projects. The program will provide \$45,000 per lane mile and \$22,000 per eligible intersection, with total project funding up to one-half of the project cost, subject to a maximum of \$900,000 per project. TARP funds may be used for project construction only.
