



NWMC Auction a Success!

Preliminary results from Tuesday's NWMC Surplus Vehicle and Equipment Auction are in. Gross sales from the thirty-nine units totaled \$116,000, of which NWMC members accounted for \$44,000. As a comparison, our inaugural January auction held last year had total sales of \$56,775, with NWMC sales of \$29,900. Thank you to the ten participating municipalities: Aurora; Campton Hills; Carol Stream; *Fox Lake; Kenilworth; Lincolnwood;* North Aurora; *Northbrook;* Park Forest; and, West Dundee.

Transportation Committee Hears Long Range Expressway Vision, STP Programming Update

The NWMC Transportation Committee met Thursday and received a presentation from Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) Senior Planner Tom Murtha on the Expressway Vision for Northeastern Illinois project. CMAP is developing the project with the Illinois Tollway and Illinois Department of Transportation to guide long-term investment in the expressway system, address challenging areas of congestion and provide new mass transit options. The project will recommend specific corridor improvements, develop strategies to handle traffic incident management and estimate potential revenue from tolling and value capture. In discussing the vision and potential outcomes of the project, the committee cautioned that any proposed changes must not negatively impact the local road network.

Staff also updated the committee on the January 24 meeting of the Surface Transportation Program (STP) Project Selection Committee. At the meeting, the group discussed potential active program management tools designed to more efficiently spend STP funds and streamline project timelines. The NWMC will work with our members and other regional councils to provide input to CMAP staff and the committee as the first draft of recommendations are being developed for the committee's March meeting. Finally, staff reported on topics from the January 16 NWMC Bicycle and Pedestrian Committee meeting, including the anticipated May start of the NWMC Multimodal Plan, the Federal Highway Administration's recent decision concerning Rapid Rectangular Flashing Beacons and recent Illinois court cases regarding municipal liability for off-street bike paths. *Staff contacts: Mike Walczak, Brian Pigeon*

Metra Seeks Feedback on Fare Proposals

Metra will hold a series of public open houses next month to gather customer feedback about several potential changes to its fare structure and ticket options. Open houses in the NWMC area are as follows:

Potential changes include: introducing a day pass for travel between any two zones on the Ventra app; discounting fares for non-rush hour trips; changing all Zone A stations except those in downtown Chicago to Zone B; consolidating Zones K, L and M into Zone J; capping fares for trips over 45 miles; changing the zones for some stations where nearby stations on a different line are in a different zone; and, gradually correcting inconsistent charges for each additional zone of travel. MMC Announces 2018 Public Sector Electric Energy Efficiency Grant Program

From the desk of Metropolitan Mayors Caucus (MMC) Executive Director Dave Bennett:

The Metropolitan Mayors Caucus is now providing the opportunity for municipalities, park districts, and libraries to save money and energy by taking advantage of financial incentives, facility assessments, and building optimization for your public sector facilities. The Metropolitan Mayors Caucus will provide guidance and technical assistance at no cost. This program is now offered in partnership with ComEd through December 31, 2018. Incentives up to \$300,000 are available, though most incentives range from \$2,000 to \$50,000 and are dependent on the expected electricity savings. Payback period for investment is usually between 1 and 5 years. Lighting upgrades, HVAC retrofits, VFDs, demand controlled ventilation, BAS upgrades, and other controls in public office buildings, garages, community centers, libraries, park districts and more are eligible.

Through the Public Sector Energy Efficiency Program, public agencies also have access to free technical assistance and project support from 360 Energy Group to recommend optimal improvements, complete technical reports, and bid specifications. *Staff contact: Mark Fowler*
