



According to the NWMC By-Laws, other nominations may be made at the April membership meeting or by mail if received prior to that meeting date. Transportation Committee Discusses New Federal Infrastructure Proposal

The NWMC Transportation Committee met Thursday to discuss the President's recently unveiled infrastructure proposal entitled "Legislative Outline for Rebuilding Infrastructure in America". It proposes to use cuts from other transportation programs to potentially leverage up to \$200 billion for infrastructure programs over ten years, relying heavily on increased state, local and private participation. The committee discussed concerns that the proposal does not address the long term viability of the federal Highway Trust Fund (which is expected to run out of revenue by FY 2021) and does not address the long term need for additional and sustainable transit funding.

Staff provided a preview of the February 28 meeting of the Surface Transportation Program (STP) Project Selection Committee, which will focus on the structure and project eligibility for the new regional STP Shared Fund (see article below). The first call for projects for the Shared Fund will be held in January, 2019. *Staff contacts: Mike Walczak, Brian Pigeon*

Bicycle and Pedestrian Committee Discuss STP Changes, Upcoming Events

The NWMC Bicycle and Pedestrian Committee met Tuesday to discuss the activities of the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning's (CMAP) Surface Transportation Program (STP) Project Selection Committee. The Project Selection Committee is tasked with establishing active program management strategies for all STP-funded projects, determining a methodology for selecting projects to receive funding from the newly created regional Shared Fund, and selecting and monitoring Shared Fund projects. The CMAP STP Project Selection Committee will meet on Wednesday, February 28, 9:30 a.m. at the CMAP offices in Chicago.

Staff also informed the committee of several upcoming bicycle and pedestrian-related events. Registration is now open for the 2018 Illinois Bike Summit, which will be held Monday, May 7 at the University of Illinois at Chicago. MMC 2018 Public Sector Electric Energy Efficiency Grant Program Reminder

From the desk of Metropolitan Mayors Caucus (MMC) Executive Director Dave Bennett:

The Metropolitan Mayors Caucus is now providing the opportunity for municipalities, park districts, and libraries to save money and energy by taking advantage of financial incentives, facility assessments, and building optimization for your public sector facilities. The Metropolitan Mayors Caucus will provide guidance and technical assistance at no cost. This program is now offered in partnership with ComEd through December 31, 2018. Incentives up to \$300,000 are available, though most incentives range from \$2,000 to \$50,000 and are dependent on the expected electricity savings. Payback period for investment is usually between 1 and 5 years. Lighting upgrades, HVAC retrofits, VFDs, demand controlled ventilation, BAS upgrades, and other controls in public office buildings, garages, community centers, libraries, park districts and more are eligible.

Through the Public Sector Energy Efficiency Program, public agencies also have access to free technical assistance and project support from 360 Energy Group to recommend optimal improvements, complete technical reports, and bid specifications. *Staff contact: Mark Fowler*
