Subject: Under \$20K Spending Report Update

Date: April 23, 2018

During the March 21, 2018 MWEBE Meeting, staff presented a plan for completing the goals of the under \$20K spend report (attachment 2). This timeline included a report identifying 100 non-local vendors to concentrate Evanston's efforts at conversion to local vendors. Since the May meeting was cancelled, this report has been updated.

<u>Background:</u> In the previous report, \$8,318,432 was identified as having the potential to be shifted to local spend. Staff has gone through this report and identified the following:

- \$364,813 of this total is actually local. For example, staff is shopping at the local Office Depot, but the billing comes through as their headquarters. The same is true for Sams Club, Ozinga, Christopher Burke, etc. A full list is identified in Attachment 1 as "local".
- An additional \$1,543,443 of the total is the result of bids. Although the individual payments may be under \$20K, these purchases are part of larger bids or RFPs that were approved by Council (i.e. Morton Salt, Duncan Parking, etc.)
- Utilities make up an additional \$644,789.
- Federal/State/Local agencies (IL Dept of Revenue, EPA, Village of Skokie, etc) make up an additional \$136,241.
- Excluding the aforementioned subsets, the remaining number of purchases is \$5,629,146.

<u>Recommendation:</u> Staff proposes starting the examination with 84 vendors, all highlighted in RED in the attached document. The total value of these vendors is \$4,075,065. These 84 vendors formed a natural break at having spends of over \$15,000 and make up over 70% of the "spend" originally listed as ripe for transition to local entities.

As mentioned in the original memo on the topic, one of the interns will begin the process of interviewing departments to better understand how they chose each of these vendors. From there, a systematic idea for diversion will be created. The committee's next update is scheduled for September 2018.

Subject: Under \$20K Spending Report Plan

Date: February 27, 2018

During the February 21, 2018 MWEBE Meeting, the Committee directed staff to begin the process of developing a plan for transitioning some of the City's expenses that are under \$20,000 (and therefore not subject to bids or RFP processes) to local vendors. The goal is to pick up where the consultant's report left off and connect the dots between where dollars are currently being spent and which Evanston businesses can provide these services. Ideally, staff believes that we can create a list of concrete changes that can be made in order to achieve the Committee's goal of spending more money within Evanston.

Due to the current workload, staff proposes utilizing summer youth employees for a portion of this work. A draft timeline is below:

- April—Tammi & Ashley analyze the list of 446 repeat under \$20K vendors to approximately 100 where efforts can be concentrated. Ashley & Tammi will look for vendors whose services cannot be duplicated in Evanston (i.e. Cook County Revenue Office, utilities, etc.).
- May MWEBE meeting—Presentation of the 100 vendors for analysis
- June—Summer Youth Project—to interview the departments using the top vendors to get a better idea of why those vendors were chosen.
- July/August—Research with the Chamber of Commerce and Economic Development team to determine if vendors within Evanston can provide a similar service.
- September MWEBE meeting—report back to the Committee with a document that clearly recommends the vendor switch
- October—Tammi meets with various departments to implement the recommended changes



Subject: City of Evanston Amazon.com Spending Guidelines

After the Under \$20K Spend Report was presented, staff was asked to identify ways to increase local spend with local Evanston Businesses. Below is a proposed policy for City staff to follow when spending on Amazon.com to encourage shopping Evanston merchants first. The draft proposed policy is for committee's consideration.

- 1. Beginning September 1, 2018, City staff will only be to use Amazon.com for purchases of approved commodities. Any other purchase will not be allowed.
- 2. All City purchases must be made through a City Amazon Business account.
- 3. All purchases will be reported to the City Council through the Bills List, plus a separate quarterly report aggregating all purchases.
- 4. Department Directors may request to the City Manager to add commodities to the approved list. Changes to the list of approved commodities will be shared with the City Council quarterly. These requests must detail that the commodity is not available for purchase in Evanston or through an existing local vendor agreement. In addition, the City may add a commodity if the department can justify operational cost savings in using Amazon.
