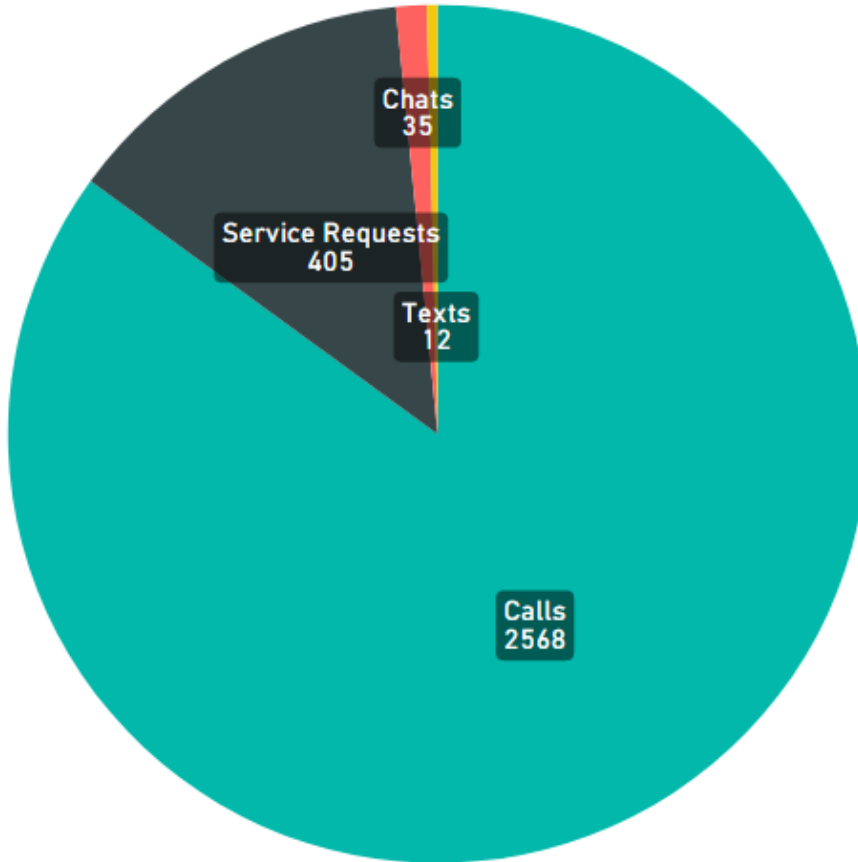

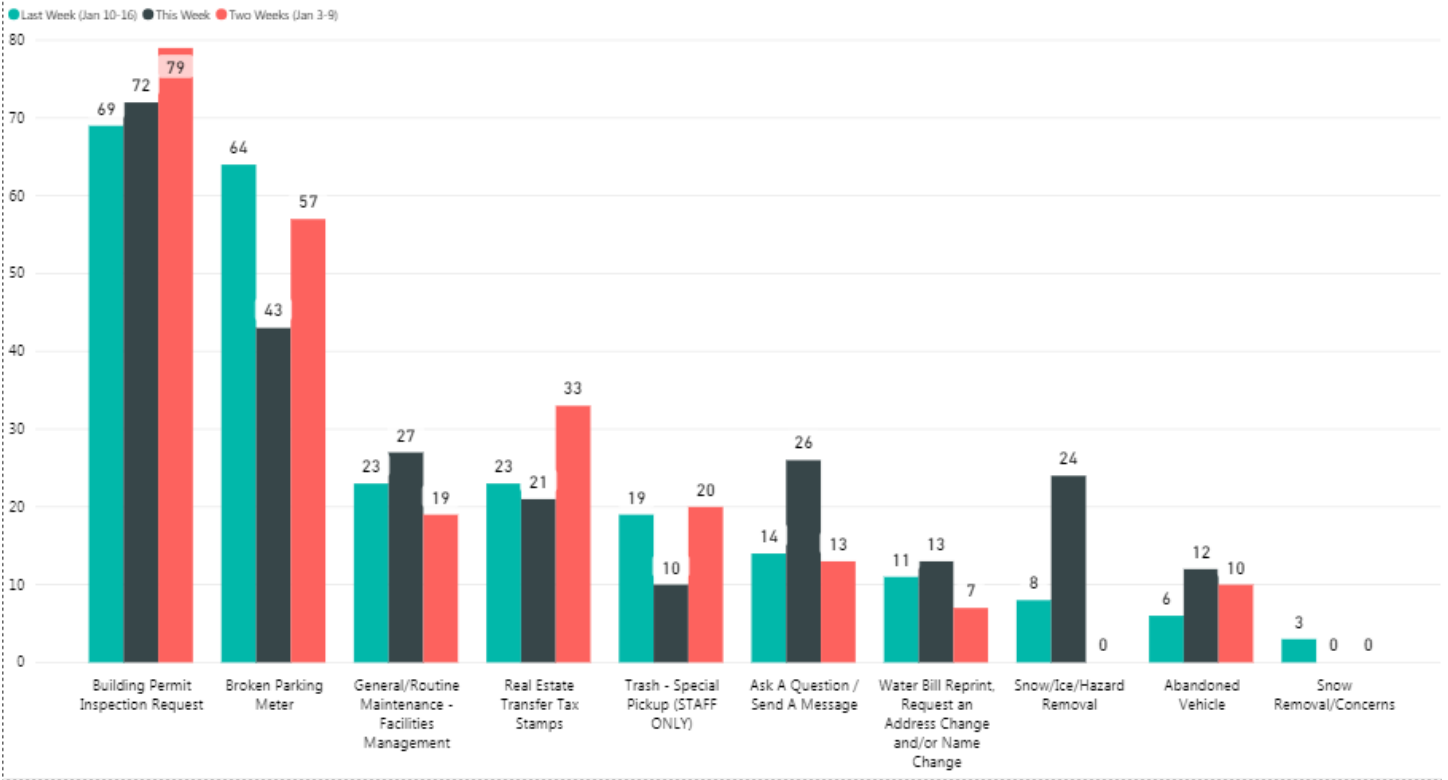

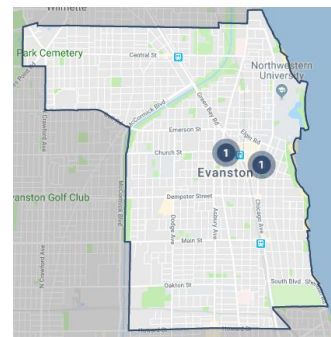
Missed Recycling Pickup

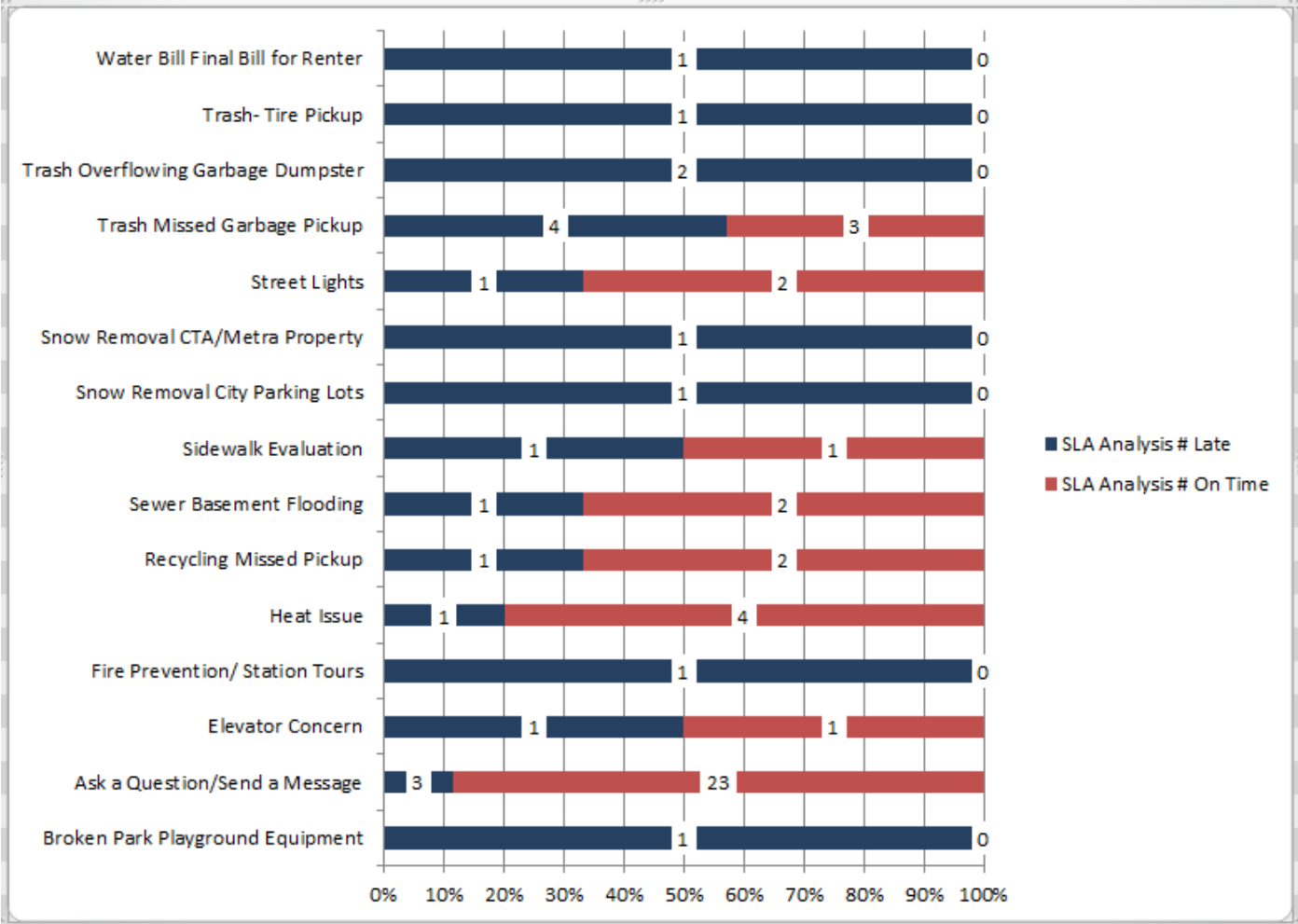

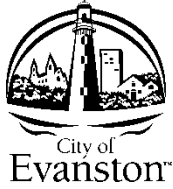

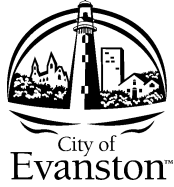

Bike and Pedestrian Committee Discuss Des Plains River Trail, Area Projects

Planning Liaisons continue to discuss Shared Fund projects with area partners. Each Council of Mayors will have 25 bonus points to distribute to shared fund projects, with no project earning more than 25 bonus points and no council allocating more than 15 points to a single project. In the coming months, each council must determine a methodology for distributing bonus points, which may require coordination among neighboring councils to support regional priorities and advance projects in the North and Northwest suburbs. ON TO 2050 Regional Water Demand Forecast Now Available

CMAP has published the [ON TO 2050 Regional Water Demand Forecast](#) to inform decisions about land use, transportation and infrastructure that affect water supply and demand. The forecast is based on the ON TO 2050 socioeconomic forecast and presents estimated water use in 5-year intervals to the year 2050 at the municipal, county, and regional scale, as well as by drinking water source and sector. The data provides individual forecasts for 245 municipalities in the region, downloadable from the [CMAP Data Hub](#). As a long-range water demand forecast, it is intended for planning purposes and is not suited for assessing infrastructure capacity.

Chicago Region's Ozone Rating Downgraded from Moderate to Serious

The Chicago metropolitan region is moving from moderate nonattainment to serious nonattainment relating to the 2008 National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). As a nonattainment area for Ozone, the CMAP region is subject to transportation conformity under the Clean Air Act of 1970. Both ON TO 2050 and the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) must demonstrate that the region conforms to the NAAQS for Ozone. Work has begun on the development of a new State Implementation Plan (SIP) with new Motor Vehicle Emission Budgets (MVEB) by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA). CMAP [presented](#) relevant data at the January 18 Transportation Committee [meeting](#) and noted that the region needs to reach attainment by July 20, 2021 to avoid being reclassified as Severe 15. *Staff contacts: Josh Klingenstein, Cole Jackson*
