





At the February 18, 2019 council meeting, Alderman Suffredin requested information about the number of unimproved alleys and the cost to improve them to a concrete alley.

The City has 206 unimproved alleys and staff estimates that the cost to improve all of these alleys is \$55 million. A map showing the locations of these alleys is attached for reference.


Alderman Suffredin also requested information on the annual cost to maintain the unimproved alleys. Our maintenance plan is to grade all unimproved alleys three times between April 1 and mid-October. This is done to eliminate potholes and ruts caused by vehicles, weather and other factors. In addition, staff has a goal to improve the condition of eighteen unimproved alleys by removing 6-inches of existing material and replacing it with asphalt grindings.

The annual cost to perform this maintenance effort is approximately \$525,000. This cost includes the cost of four City-owned vehicles used to perform the work based on IDOT standard billing rates for that type of equipment, and the rental cost for a roller. The cost also includes the labor cost for five City employees assigned to perform the work.

Keeping the alleys in good condition and ultimately improving them to have a concrete surface helps to minimize maintenance costs of the sanitation vehicles used to collect recycling materials and special pickups.

Transportation Committee Discusses Complete Streets, Transportation Funding

The NWMC Transportation Committee met on Thursday and received a presentation on complete streets and active transportation policies from McHenry Council of Mayors Planning Liaison Cody Sheriff. Mr. Sheriff described the economic, health, and equity benefits of implementing these policies, and reviewed the elements necessary for a successful complete streets policy. Complete streets policies are a scoring factor for the <u>STP Shared</u> Fund, and may be included as evaluation criteria in local council STP methodologies as well.
