





SPC Announces New Combined Office Supplies & Janitorial Supplies Contract!

The Suburban Purchasing Cooperative (SPC) Governing Board is pleased to announce the award of a combined Office Supplies & Janitorial Supplies Contract (#189) by piggybacking onto the National Cooperative Purchasing Alliance (NCPA) agreement with American Office Products Distributors (AOPD), solicited and awarded by lead agency Region XIV Education Service Center (ESC), Abilene, Texas. The contract is effective immediately and will expire on May 31, 2020. The contract can then be renewed annually for an additional five years, if mutually agreed to by Region XIV ESC and American Office Products Distributors, Inc. (AOPD).

The contract vendor for these programs is Warehouse Direct of *Des Plaines*, who has been a valued vendor for the SPC for over ten years. Combining Office Supplies and Janitorial Supplies onto one contract will simplify ordering for contract participants. Under the contract, orders are delivered next day with no minimum order requirement and free standard delivery.

Under this agreement, all Suburban Purchasing Cooperative members, non-profit and "public agency" participants will be grouped under one Master SPC Account to aggregate all purchases towards volume rebate incentives. Additionally, individual entities will receive up to a 1% e-commerce rebate paid in the form of a credit towards future purchases no later than 45 days from the end of each quarter (40-79% online = 0.5% rebate; 80% or more purchased online = 1% rebate).

Bike and Pedestrian Committee Discusses Area Plans, Scooter Legislation

The NWMC Bicycle and Pedestrian Committee met Tuesday and heard a presentation on the *Village of Glencoe's* recently completed <u>Active Transportation Plan</u> from *Management Analyst Adam Hall*. The village, park district and school district worked collaboratively with the Active Transportation Alliance to develop the plan, which provides a framework for advancing health, equity, safety, economic, social, and environmental goals. The plan also identifies priority infrastructure projects and educational initiatives designed to improve active transportation in the village.

Staff discussed the NWMC Multimodal Plan update, including the project timeline and website development. The website will launch in early March, and will host project updates, a public survey, a visual preference survey, and video content. Staff will send a link to the website once it has been launched. Additionally, staff revealed the branding for the plan, which was recently completed by the Lakota Group.

The committee also discussed <u>House Bill 1590</u>, aka the "Scooter Bill." The legislation defines low-speed electric scooters, requirements for their use and provisions for them to be used on bicycle facilities. The committee expressed significant concerns on the implications for local communities, which will be considered by the NWMC Legislative Committee.

Finally, members of the committee gave updates on bike and pedestrian projects in their communities. The *Village of Wilmette* gave an overview of their Active Transportation Plan, which is nearing completion. The *Village of Schaumburg* then gave an update on changes to the village's bike month activities and the *Village of Glenview* and other members gave an update on progress relating to future Skokie Valley Trail improvements. *Staff contacts: Josh Klingenstein, Cole Jackson*

North Shore Council Sub-Committee Discusses STP Methodology, Shared Fund

Update on Transportation Funding Opportunities

As previously reported, the <u>Call for Projects</u> for the STP regional Shared Fund, CMAQ, and TAP-L is about to close with applications due through CMAP's <u>eTIP</u> database by today, March 1 for Planning Liaison review. Before the final March 15 deadline, planning liaisons will review, revise, and submit the applications in coordination with the project sponsor. June 1 is the deadline for obtaining design approval or submission of PDR documents. The applications will undergo reviews by CMAP project selection committees and the public over the summer, with final selection announced in October.

Other available funding opportunities include Cook County's <u>Invest in Cook</u>, which will award \$8.5 million to transportation improvement projects throughout Cook County. Applications must be submitted by Friday, March 15. Trail funding is available through the <u>Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) Trails Grant</u>, with applications due Thursday, March 14. Finally, open space projects can apply for the <u>Open Lands, ComEd Green Region Grant</u>, which offers up to \$10,000 in funding (see additional information below). The deadline to apply is Friday, March 15.
