Media Focuses on Public Safety Pension Fund Consolidation

Over the past two weeks, a number of media reports have focused on public safety pension fund consolidation and the soon-to-be-released report from Governor Pritzker's Pension Consolidation Feasibility Task Force. On September 24, Capitol Fax reported on a statement from the Illinois Public Pension Fund Association (IPPFA) cautioning lawmakers against a "rush to push through" any changes to over 650 individual police and fire pension funds. A number of local pension fund attorneys have been circulating the IPPFA model resolution and details from the Governor's task force report, which have not been made public at this point.

The NWMC and the Pension Fairness for Illinois Communities Coalition have been advocating for consolidation of public safety pension funds for a decade and a 2017 Coalition white paper showed a \$33 million annual savings to taxpayers by consolidating the funds into the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund (IMRF). Another report this week by Champaign station WCIA reporter Mark Maxwell and picked up by WGN and Capitol Fax further shines a light on the issue and the IPPFA.

The NWMC and the Pension Fairness for Illinois Communities Coalition stand ready to analyze the Task Force report and will provide that analysis to the membership as soon as the report is released. *Staff contacts: Mark Fowler, Larry Bury, Chris Staron*
