Governor Signs Public Safety Pension Fund Consolidation Bill

On Wednesday, Governor Pritzker signed Senate Bill 1300, which is now Public Act 101-0610. As previously reported, Senate Bill 1300 established the Firefighter's Pension Investment Fund and the Police Officer's Pension Investment Fund for the purposes of investing funds for the nearly 650 local public safety pension funds. The law, which goes into effect on January 1, 2020, outlines the selection process and duties of the transition board of trustees (see article below) who are tasked with establishing the funds over the next twelve months.
