NWMC Board Talks Revenue Issues with IDOR Director Harris

Thank you to the twenty-one members who attended Wednesday night's NWMC Board meeting. Illinois Department of Revenue (IDOR) Director David Harris briefed members on a number of items, including the state budget, tax amnesty collection estimates and adult use recreational cannabis revenues. He encouraged local governments to enroll in the <u>MyLocalTax</u> Portal, which allows users to order tax allocation reports, view correspondence and verify tax locations. Finally, Director Harris discussed the Parking Excise Tax and legislative efforts to fully exempt local governments from the tax as well as issues regarding Amazon's collection and remittance of the Retailers Occupation Tax.

In other Board action, members approved the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus 2020 legislative priorities and discussed the third quarter update to the FY19-20 NWMC Work Plan. This serves as notification that the application period for the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Federal Emergency Management Agency's Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program (AFG) will open on Monday, February 3, 2020, at 8:00 AM (Eastern). The application period for the FY 2019 AFG Program closes on Friday, March 13, 2020 at 5 p.m. (Eastern).

The *Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act, 2019* (Pub. L. No. 116-6) includes \$350 million for the Assistance to Firefighter Grant (AFG) Grant Program and the Fire Prevention and Safety (FP&S) Grant Program. The amount of \$315 million will assist first-responder organizations that need support to improve their capability to respond to fires and emergencies of all types under the AFG Program, and the remaining \$35 million will be allocated to fund the FY19 FP&S Program.

The purpose of the AFG Program is to enhance the safety of the public and firefighters with respect to fire and firerelated hazards. The program provides direct financial assistance to eligible fire departments, nonaffiliated emergency medical service (EMS) organizations and State Fire Training Academies (SFTA). The funds provide critically needed resources that equip and train emergency personnel to recognized standards, enhance operational efficiencies, foster interoperability, and support community resilience.
