### Governor Extends Stay at Home Order Through May 30

On Thursday, Governor JB Pritzker announced the extension of the stay at home order through Saturday, May 30. During his daily press conference, he explained that data shows expected peak fatalities from COVID-19 in Illinois to occur in late April/early May, necessitating continuation of the order. "This is the part where we have to dig in," he said. "We have to understand that the sacrifices that we have made as a state to avoid a worst case scenario are working and we need to keep going a little while longer to finish the job."

Governor Pritzker outlined some "practical adjustments" to the extended order, which will take effect on Friday, May 1. Among the modifications is the resumption of elective medical procedures that were delayed due to the crisis. Others include: phased reopening of state parks; fishing, boating and golf under strict safety guidelines; identification of new "essential businesses" including greenhouses, garden centers, nurseries and animal grooming services; re-opening of non-essential businesses to fulfill telephone/online orders for delivery and outside pick-up; and, allowing educational institutions to establish procedures for pick-up of student belongings, supplies and dormitory move-outs.

Finally, the Governor's new order includes a requirement for Illinois residents to use face coverings when in stores and other public places where social distancing measures cannot be maintained. Several NWMC municipalities have proactively implemented this measure, including *Buffalo Grove, Deerfield, Des Plaines, Evanston, Glencoe, Glenview, Highland Park, Morton Grove, Niles, Northbrook, Park Ridge, Skokie, Wilmette* and *Winnetka*. #### NWMC Here to Help Update

On Thursday evening, staff sent the eighth update in a series of NWMC member responses to the Business/Resident Assistance and Best Practices document created in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Four members provided new or updated information, including *Hanover Park, Lincolnshire, Lincolnwood* and *Wilmette*. To date, thirty NWMC members have contributed to the list.

In this week's update, staff identified NWMC members who have adopted ordinances, directives or recommendations regarding the use of face coverings. As a reminder, a new section was added to the document last week – Event Cancellations. Staff will keep a rolling list of events that municipalities have cancelled, including the name of the event, the criteria used to determine the cancellation and the decision making authority (elected officials, staff, etc.). Please keep the responses coming in and staff will send periodic updates as significant member responses and updates are received.

On Wednesday, staff sent letters to NWMC area lawmakers regarding the organization's priorities for the remainder of the spring legislative session and to county board chairs regarding property tax collection and disbursement concerns. Staff will continue to monitor federal, state and local COVID-19 news, conference calls and press conferences, and will share pertinent information as it becomes available.
