



Overall Turnout Comparison


Presidential Primary Overall Turnout

Early Voting Turnout in Presidential Primaries




COVID-19 Voter Outreach























Democrat vs. Republican Ballots Cast


Dem vs. Rep Ballots Cast in Primary Proportions



Republican Presidential Primary Results






Democratic Cook County State's Attorney Primary Results

Republican Cook County State's Attorney Primary Results












Referendum on Nonpartisan Local Elections

Conclusions

- Fear of COVID-19 kept many potential voters at home, depressing voter turnout across Cook County and Evanston
- Precincts with many Northwestern students experienced particularly low voter turnout, following a historical trend, but also exacerbated by COVID-19
- Very few Republican Primary ballots were requested due to President Trump's incumbency
- 4. Early Voting continues to grow in popularity

- 3. Begin preparations for the 2021 Municipal Election




