NWMC Here to Help Update

As we reported last week, all health regions in the NWMC service territory moved to the Phase 4: Revitalization mitigation guidelines under the Restore Illinois plan. While Regions 8 (DuPage/Kane counties) and 9 (Lake/McHenry counties) are following the state's <u>Phase 4 Guidelines for Reopening</u>, the Cook County Department of Public Health implemented more restrictive mitigation measures, mirroring those recently implemented in Chicago. This week, the county eased those measures via <u>Order No. 2021-3</u>; however, the order is still more restrictive than the full Phase 4.

On Wednesday, Governor Pritzker announced expansion of those eligible to receive the vaccine under Phase 1b to include individuals under age 65 with high risk medical conditions and those with disabilities. The expansion will begin on February 25 and was implemented based on the expectation that vaccine delivery will substantially increase in the coming weeks. All of the counties in the NWMC service territory will expand the eligibility except Cook County, who announced Thursday that Phase 1b eligibility will not be expanded due to the lack of vaccine for those who currently qualify and the over one million individuals that would be newly eligible. Also on Thursday, the Biden administration announced the purchase of another 200 million doses of the vaccines currently authorized in the U.S., which will be enough to fully vaccinate all 300 million eligible Americans by the end of July.

This morning at 11:00 a.m., the U.S. House Committee on Oversight and Reform will consider legislation providing direct Coronavirus funding to state and local governments. As called for in President Biden's \$1.9 trillion <u>American</u> <u>Rescue Plan</u>, \$350 billion in emergency funding is proposed for state, local, and territorial governments. On Wednesday, staff forwarded published estimates for each NWMC member. That information, along with a link to the hearing can be found on the committee's <u>website</u>.
