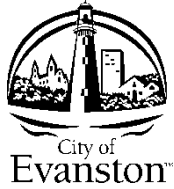

Executive Board Sets September 8 NWMC Board Agenda

The NWMC Executive Board met Wednesday to discuss and approve the agenda for the September 8 NWMC Board of Directors meeting. Staff will provide updates on COVID-19 mask and vaccination executive orders as well as progress on the FY21-22 NWMC Work plan. The Board will consider recommended appointments to the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus Executive Committee and appointments to the NWMC Committees for FY2021-2022. The Board will also consider a recommendation from the Executive Board to support the candidacy of Aurora Chief Financial Officer Chris Minick for election to one of two vacant positions on the Illinois Firefighter Pension Investment Fund Board of Trustees. *Schaumburg Village President Tom Dailly* is running unopposed for the other vacancy.

Staff will discuss the new alliance between the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative (SPC) and Sourcewell, which more than quadruples the products and services offered thru the SPC. Members will consider the FY22 scope of services and budget to secure transportation planning funds through the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning. Finally, members of the Northwest Council of Mayors will consider a recommendation from the Technical Committee to approve a functional classification change request for Northgate Parkway in the *Village of Wheeling*. The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) is seeking applications from Cook County individuals, organizations and businesses for the 2021 Sustainable Landscaping and Biosolids Beneficial Reuse Awards until Wednesday, September 15. The awards recognize the activities and innovations from entities, such as municipalities, park districts, schools, golf courses and athletic clubs in two separate categories: Sustainable Landscaping; and, Beneficial Use of Exceptional Quality (EQ) Biosolids and Compost.

Activities completed after January 1, 2016 are eligible for an award, and an individual or organization is eligible once every five years. Qualifications for the Sustainable Landscaping award may be demonstrated through the innovative use of green infrastructure, capital investment, and how an individual or organization promotes green landscaping to educate the community. Submittals should include figures, illustrations, narrative and photos to help further explain the efforts. The evaluation process may include a site visit.
