Subject: Lakefront Parking Pilot Program Update

Date: September 7, 2021

The City of Evanston implemented a lakefront parking pilot program beginning the week of August 2 through October 31. As part of this pilot program, parking rates for vehicles without a current year paid Evanston wheel tax was set at \$3 an hour at designated streets along the lakefront. Enforcement was between 8 a.m. and 9 p.m., seven days a week. Pay stations were installed for coin or credit card transactions, and zones were created to allow for payment via the ParkEvanston app.

The pilot program covers the following locations:

- 1700 through 1800 Sheridan Road
- 1400 Sheridan Road (Arrington Lagoon lot)
- 1400 Sheridan Road (Dawes Park lot)
- 500 through 600 blocks of Sheridan Square on the east side
- 2611 Sheridan Road (Lighthouse beach lot)

From the period of August 2 through August 31 (30 days), the City received 8,289 transactions for a total of **\$46,938.71**. The average transaction was \$5.66 and the average total per day was \$1,564.62. The breakdown of how the transactions were paid is: 4,538 of the transactions were made via the pay stations, and 3,751 were made via the ParkEvanston app.

IDOT Accepting Applications for Truck Access Route Program

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) provided a Notice of Funding Opportunity for FFY 2023 <u>Truck Access Route Program (TARP)</u> funding on Friday, September 3. TARP provides funding for projects intended to upgrade roadways to accommodate 80,000 pound truckloads. Eligible projects must start at a truck generator or designated truck route or municipality and end at another designated truck route or municipality. The program provides \$45,000 per lane mile and \$22,000 per eligible intersection, with total project funding capped at half of the total project cost or \$900,000 per project. Only construction costs are eligible to be covered under the program. Completed project applications should be submitted to the appropriate IDOT Local Roads and Streets office no later than 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 15. Project awards are anticipated to be announced during the week of November 15.
