








2021 MSYEP Participation by Ward

Career Pathways Program

Offered in partnership with Youth Job Center of Evanston (YJC) and Mayor's Employer Advisory Council (MEAC)

Program offers comprehensive job readiness training and education for under-skilled, at-risk, and re-entry youth and young adults. Receiving paid, on-the-job training, participants are prepared to graduate from roles as workplace "interns" to viable career focused permanent employees.
