Cases: Evanston reported 163 [new confirmed COVID-19 cases over the last seven days](#), compared to 172 for the week prior. The current seven-day moving average of daily confirmed cases is 23.29.

Monkeypox Update

The monkeypox outbreak is rising quickly with 571 cases in Illinois, of which 459 cases are from Chicago and five cases are from Evanston. While anyone can get infected with monkeypox, transmissions and outbreaks have mainly

been in patients who identify as gay, bisexual, or other men who have sex with men.
