

Situation Report - August 11, 2022

Cases: Evanston reported 119 [new confirmed COVID-19 cases over the last seven days](#), compared to 163 for the week prior. The current seven-day moving average of daily confirmed cases is 17.00.

Monkeypox Update

As of today, Illinois is reporting 734 Monkeypox cases of which 584 of the cases including 30 hospitalizations are from Chicago. Evanston is currently reporting 7 cases and no hospitalizations at this time. While anyone can get infected with Monkeypox, the transmission and outbreaks have been mainly

with patients who identify as gay, bisexual, or other men who have sex with men.
