Re: 1621-1631 Chicago Avenue Building Proposal by Horizon Realty Group (HRG)

We, owners of units in the Church-Hinman Condominiums, write to urge the City Council to reject (once again!), this proposal, which has persistently ignored the objections that were raised in 2018 (twice), 2020, and 2022. Most of what we have to say has been said already in many of the letters and emails submitted in 2020, from which we will quote relevant passages. All of the letters and emails on file, which are available to the public, objected to this project. Not one supports it:

What the Base Zoning for the D-4 Transitional District Specifies

The D-4 Transitional district is intended as a step-down from the business district to the west of Chicago Avenue. The base zoning for this site calls for a limit of 54 units, a maximum height of 105 feet, a maximum of 8-10 stories, an FAR (Floor-Area Ratio) not exceeding 5.4, at least 119 parking spaces, and 2 loading docks. (The Floor-Area Ratio is the total square footage of the residential units plus the total square footage of the residential circulation areas divided by the total square footage of the building lot.)

HRG'S current proposal calls for 15 stories, 140 units, a height of 165 feet, an FAR of 6.33, 57 parking spaces, and 2 loading docks.

HRG's Previous Proposals for This Site

HRG has been seeking approval for a large building on this site since the spring of 2018:

- 1) May 2018: the initial proposal2 called for 156 units, a height of 145 feet, an FAR of 7.9, and 119 parking spaces, with just one loading dock. It was *rejected*.
- 2) December 2018: HRG resubmitted a revised plan, in which the figures had ballooned to 240 units, a height of 212 feet, an FAR of 11.6, and 85 parking spaces, again with just one loading dock. This too was *rejected*.
- 3) 2020: Undeterred, HRG came back with a third plan. The building was to be less gargantuan than the December 2018 version, but still far in excess of the limits specified in the base zoning ordinance, with 180 units. The 185 foot height and the 85 parking spaces remained unchanged. Again, this proposal was *rejected*. But luckily for HRG, building proposals are not baseball. After three strikes, you can come back for a fourth (or even a fifth)!

4) 2022: The 2022 version made some modest concessions. It specified 2 loading docks instead of 1. But the height remained at 185 feet (195 feet of actual height)—and it proposed just 57 parking spaces! HRG claimed that the building will attract residents who will use public transportation and therefore required less parking). The FAR was said to be "about 7.8," according to the analysis of the Community Development Department, April 6, 2022. The 2 loading docks were 1 short of the 3 specified by the zoning ordinance for a standard building of this increased height and density. This too was **rejected** (following a 7-0 recommendation of disapproval by the LUC).

Which Brings Us to the Current Proposal: #5

The proposal now before us calls for a height of 165 feet (157% of basic zoning maximum); 15 Stories (150% of basic zoning maximum); 140 units (260% of basic zoning maximum); 57 parking spaces (0.48% of basic zoning minimum 119); FAR 6.33 (117% of basic zoning maximum) with 2 loading docks—which nominally complies with basic zoning minimum, but that assumes an 8-10 story building with no more than 54 units. This building really should have 3. In short, this building doesn't just violate one or two zoning requirements—it violates all of them, with the dubious exception of the loading dock minimum

Height and Density

A 157% increase of height and a 150% increase in number of stories is is not a minor "allowance," and the crucial increase from 54 to 140 units means the building would be over two and a half times the density recommended by D-4 zoning. (These are essentially the same objections voiced in opposition to the previous four versions, with somewhat different numbers.)

As two residents 522 Church wrote in 2020 (Letter 1), granting this proposal "would allow development of this site virtually without reference to the parameters of the existing underlying zoning district." A resident of the existing high-rise at 1630 Chicago Avenue remarked (Letter 9) that the proposed building "is out of character with the D-4 district, which is intended to provide a step-down/transition from the taller building on the other [West] side of Chicago Avenue . . . to the smaller apartment buildings and single-family homes within the D-4 area." The comment still applies

The height alone should be a deal breaker. In its detailed analysis of this proposal (April 6, 2022), the Community Development Dept's Planning and Zoning Division recommended "reducing the proposed height to between 8 and 10 stories to match the Downtown Plan's development framework." At roughly half the height of the proposed tower, this would be a completely different building.

As another resident of 522 Church Street put it in 2020 (Letter 5): "Once again the Developers have submitted essentially the same proposal that was submitted in 2018 and again this past spring." All of the public letters remark on the developer's refusal to respond to previous criticism by bringing the project down to appropriate scale. That remains true of this latest version.

Traffic and Parking

As yet another resident of 522 Church wrote (Letter 2), "the developer unrealistically hopes that a majority of their renters will use public transportation." Even in the current version, 52% percent of residents would have to be without cars. Otherwise, many residents would have to find street parking, which means that parking for businesses along Chicago Avenue and nearby on Davis and Church, and also for residents living nearby, would be harder to find.

HRG has suggested leasing off-site parking. But this move would merely offload the parking shortage onto the community at large, since those spaces would become unavailable to anyone else.

Letter 1 also points out that the new development would disrupt the federally-funded bike path on the East side of Chicago Avenue, in which case bike riders would "return to their previous patterns of using Chicago Avenue and the sidewalks." It notes that "the exit and entry conflicts with the present access to Whole Foods," adding to the congestion that already occurs at the intersection of Church and Chicago, to the extent that "recently, safety vehicles on their way to an emergency were unable to move," owing to traffic jams on Chicago Avenue.

And then there is the matter of the alley that would separate the back of the new building from the First United Methodist Church and the 6-story apartment building at 1616 Hinman, just south of the church. Parking for 1616 Hinman can be accessed only through the alley.

The church has relied on this alley for parking. As a lay leader of the church (Letter 8) remarked, "[t]here have been numerous times that I have been stuck in our church parking lot, once for 25 minutes, because both ends of the alley were blocked by trucks making deliveries and doing work for the businesses and residents on Chicago Avenue. Adding a building of this size would greatly exacerbate this already bad situation."

Other neighbors also rely on this alley for parking, one of whom wrote (Letter 6) of having "missed appointments and been late for engagements" because the alley is frequently blocked.

We also note that the alley is littered with overflowing garbage from the businesses now occupying the 1621-1631 Chicago Avenue sites, already owned by HRG. The poor condition of the alley at present bodes ill for the future if the proposed tower is built and managed by the same owners. (See Alley Photos, Appendix B.)

The Intention of the Inclusionary Housing Ordinance

The intention of the Inclusionary Housing Ordinance (IHO) is to encourage developers to provide affordable housing for those who cannot afford market price rents. For each unit set aside for IHO renters, developers are awarded a set number of points to apply toward an allowance. HRG asks for 100 dwelling units (remember, the basic D-4 zoning ordinance caps dwelling units at 54!) plus 10 to be at reduced rent, for which the developer would get a bonus of 4 X 10 = 40 units, bringing the total to 140.

If HRG wishes to provide affordable housing units, that is laudable. But the city's incentive should not be used to foist a building that far exceeds ordinance specifications on the surrounding neighborhood.

Impact on Residential Neighborhood East of Chicago Avenue

A 165-foot tower backing onto the alley between Hinman and Chicago would completely obliterate afternoon sunlight for those of us living in the 1600 block of Hinman, and probably along the east side Judson Ave.

The overflow of cars without on-site parking spaces would put more pressure on street parking in our neighborhood. It would also make pedestrian, auto, and bicycle traffic near the intersection of Church Street and Chicago Avenue even more congested and accident-conducive than it already is.

In Conclusion

The new proposal is an insufficiently modified version of the old one, which was an insufficiently modified version of the one before. It was a bad idea (twice) in 2018, a bad idea in 2020, a bad idea in 2022, and still a bad idea in 2023. At the end of its report of April 6, 2022, the Community Development Department bluntly summarizes its findings: "This application is noncompliant." Unless HRG makes a serious effort to reduce the scale of the project, which none of these four proposals has done, it will remain noncompliant and unwelcome.

We strongly urge you to reject it. We also ask that the city stop rewarding HRG's bad faith by wasting the city's time (to say nothing of ours!) on further reviews of this scheme, which keeps coming back like the proverbial bad penny.

I'm writing today to share my opposition to the 1621-31 Chicago Ave development currently under consideration by the Land Use Commission.

From my research, several pressing reasons why this proposal is not a good fit for downtown Evanston have been raised repeatedly by community members over the course of several years. Not only does the proposal not meet the requirements of the D4 Transition District where it is located, but is is far beyond the scale of the surrounding buildings and not aligned with the Comprehensive General Plan. These issues alone suggest this proposal should be rejected. From an equity perspective, I was also disappointed to see the analysis in the packet for Wednesday's meeting that while the current proposal does meet the City's minimum requirement for the number affordable units, it no longer includes additional

units that were previously included.

Yet my greatest concern is about safety, which seems to have been overlooked by the proposal's inadequate Alley Management Plan. This issue is personal for me: our child attends daycare at the church that shares the alley. My family does drop off / pick up each day around 730am and 5pm. Especially at 5pm, the area around Chicago and Church is already challenging to navigate with cars, bikers, and pedestrians. Parking - even for a few minutes - is often difficult to find. Adding a large building with over 140 units at the proposed location would undoubtedly exacerbate an already challenging situation for drivers at rush hour, families trying to safely pick up their young children, bikers, and pedestrians. I strong urge the commission to reject this proposal.

Hi Meghan and Liz,

I am writing to voice opposition to the proposed development by Horizon Group on Chicago Ave between Davis and Church. I live on Davis not far away from the proposed site. While I am typically pro-development for the reasons that I think contributes to Evanston's success (increased tax based, more people visiting more retail and restaurants, providing increased diversity, and a denser population to support public transportation), I am staunchly opposed to the proposed development for several reasons listed below:

- 1. The proposed height of the building is far above what is allowed in this transition area. If this is passed as proposed, there will be no transition between the downtown area and the church and residences that sit immediately to the east of the building. The height variance alone should be enough to kill this project. The developers keep amending their proposal but not to the specs of the City.
- 2. The proposed parking variance will create quite a jam. This is already a pretty busy stretch of traffic. If the number of cars heading northbound (to park in the public parking) increases much beyond the current level, we will have traffic backing up to turn right (east) on to Church to access the garage. As you likely know. The light for northbound traffic is green for probably 30 seconds before access is granted to turn right. When cars back up from the short distance they have to get out of the single lane traffic on Chicago, no cars can head north either. This will back traffic up to Davis and perhaps beyond all because not enough cars can turn.
- 3. The proposed variance on loading docks is unnecessary. Without 3 loading docks, trucks will have to back up (and beep) at hours likely to disturb neighbors. In addition, this alley is already one of the toughest in the City to navigate through.
- 4. The developer, in particular Jeffrey Michaels, COO, has proven himself to be an antagonistic adversary on multiple calls. He is rude and hostile on calls. I personally have been on three conference calls with him where I felt the need to jump in and reprimand him for the way he was talking to our citizens, our appointed city officials and our elected city officials. This is his behavior when he is asking for a favor. Consider how he will behave when he has his permits and building erected.
- 5. There is enough shady business practices with Horizon to merit further investigation. He and his father have moved money around in a shell game designed to avoid paying legal penalties for groups that have sued them because of their practices as landlords.
- 6. Jeffrey Michaels lies. He claimed multiple times to be a friend of small Evanston businesses, but as an investor in Found, I know for a fact that he denied Amy Morton a new lease. He is kicking out his current tenants there to make room for the new building. He has claimed that he offered every business a chance to renew, which is false. In addition, when Amy Morton (Found owner/operator) asked for two more weeks in October 2022 to continue the lease and paying for it, he denied her that. In addition, he forced her to spend money to upgrade the property that he plans on demolishing, further destroying value and good will, and signaling a malicious intent, certainly not behaving as a "friend to Evanston small businesses".

Make no mistake, Horizon and Jeffrey Michaels are in this to line their pockets with cash. I have no problem with capitalism, but this version of lying and exploiting and cheating others out of legal settlements is not playing on a level field. Dear Ms. Jones -

We have filled out and sent to the city the automated form regarding the 1621-1631 Chicago Ave. proposed building. My wife Cornelia Spelman and I are entirely opposed to this building, which according to city regulations seems clearly in violation of zoning/building codes. It's a building that will irreparably damage the residential neighborhood to the east, as well as creating annoying and potentially dangerous street problems on Chicago Ave and alley problems behind it (with move-ins, deliveries, services, etc.) The enumeration of specific problems has been well-itemized by Robert Froetscher.

- i. The building is too tall, with too many units for the "D4 Transition District" in which it is located
- ii. This 15 story proposed building is completely out of scale with its neighboring buildings which are 8 and 9 stories tall. It is inconsistent with the adopted plan for downtown Evanston and inconsistent with the Comprehensive General Plan.
- iii. The building will make traffic much worse due to the additional 225 + residents and their need for taxis, Ubers, Lyfts, GrubHub and DoorDash deliveries and package deliveries from Amazon, FedEx, UPS and others.
- iv. The building plans to use the already congested alley in the back for access resident's parking and to the buildings loading docks. This will create additional congestion and dangerous conditions for cars and pedestrians on Church Street and in the alley.
- v. This proposed building will damage property values in the neighborhood for all the reasons above
- vi. This proposed building is completely inconsistent with the zoning on this block of Chicago Ave, which is designated as a "D4 Transition District" and is intended to have buildings no more than 6-10 stories tall as a transition to the residential community behind it on Hinman Ave.

PUBLIC COMMENTS TO THE LAND USE COMMISSION FOR ITS MARCH 8, 2023 MEETING CONCERNING 1621-31 CHICAGO AVENUE

FROM DENNIS HARDER, RESIDENT AT 522 CHURCH STREET

Over the past several years, the owners of 1621-31 Chicago Avenue have submitted a number of proposals for redevelopment of the site over the past several years. Through established review processes, the community and the City have reviewed the proposals in-depth, and in each instance the proposed project has been withdrawn or formally disapproved.

The heart of the matter comes down to these considerations:

- The proposed development at 1621-31 Chicago Avenue is eligible for review under the Planned Development provisions of the City Zoning Ordinance, which provisions allow for approval of projects, components of which may be out of conformity with certain prescriptions of the Zoning Ordinance. Such components might include building height, number of dwelling units, floor area ratio, number of parking spaces and/or loading docks. Further, the proponent is required to enumerate the reasons why the proposed variations from established standards should be approved, citing in particular the benefits to the City and the community.
- The owner of 1921-31 Chicago Avenue has proposed a project that exceeds or otherwise does not meet the standards of the Zoning Ordinance in terms of, for example, building height, number of units, minimum parking spaces, etc. etc. as have been enumerated by many others.
- At this stage of the current review process, the Land Use commission is asked to judge
 whether the proposed variations do or will generate the ascribed benefits and whether
 those benefits are sufficient to warrant approval of the project.
- These judgements are complex undertakings, requiring reflection on the quantitative (height in feet, numbers of units and parking spaces, etc.) as well as the qualitative (building design features, impacts on adjacent public rights-of-way, environmental effects from wind or shadow, etc.). Further, benefits may be proposed that are not related to the physical attributes of the proposal (for example, cash contributions to a particular public or quasi-public entity or facility).

In summation, I understand that the essence of the responsibility the Land use Commission has in this matter is determining whether the current 1621-31 Chicago Avenue development proposal contains sufficient benefits to warrant approval of the requested zoning variances. These benefits, described on pp 22 and 23 of the Proposed Planned Development Narrative, consist of several educational and vocational support overtures, a physical alley improvement program and management plan, and assorted other commitments, all of which would be welcomed by the community for any appropriately-scaled redevelopment of the property. However, no credible relationship has been established between these benefits and the requested variances for building height and for the number of dwelling units in the project. In other words, this imbalance would strongly favor the developer, not the community, and therefore is sufficient basis for not recommending approval of this proposal.

We are writing this comment in consideration of the proposal to develop 1621-31 Chicago Avenue.

We own and reside in a condominium at 522 Church Street and our apartment faces south, directly on the site of the proposed development.

We are submitting this comment in the event that we are unable to attend the meeting of the Land Use Commission and given that the developer has chosen to-date to not submit responses to staff questions in writing for the public to review.

We believe that the Land Use Commission should not approve this development as currently proposed because it is unambiguously not in compliance with the Standards of Approval for Special Use which clearly state that "Each planned development shall be compatible with surrounding development and not be of such a nature in height, bulk, or scale as to exercise any influence contrary to the purpose and intent of the Zoning Ordinance as set forth in Section 6-1-2."

Our primary concern (which is shared by staff) is the height variance requested by the developer. As indicated by staff, "
The proposal for 15 stories is noticeably out of scale with proximate development on the east side of Chicago Avenue. We believe the development should be reduced to a height of between 8 and 10 stories to match the Downtown Plan's development framework."

We have observed as this developer has consistently ignored consideration of the character of the neighborhood in which this project is proposed to be constructed in each of the several proposals they have submitted. An 15 story building at this location is substantially larger than any other building on the east side of Chicago Avenue, including the building immediately south of the proposed development that was constructed by the developer not long ago. The east side of the street begins a transition from the larger commercial and residential structures on the west side and the lower rise residential apartment buildings and private homes on Hinman Avenue.

We believe that the City should reject this substantial variance from the zoning requirements.

We are also concerned with the state of the alley that runs behind the proposed building and that is, according to this project plan, intended to provide access to both parking and the loading docks.

The alley, which was already in need of repair, was further damaged by the construction of the north building of the Merion (also a project of this developer). The likely damage to the alley as a result of this proposed construction would render it unusable.

Should this or any other proposal by this developer proceed, they should be expected to bring the alley to a state consistent with the traffic created by the increased density resulting from their project.

I am an Evanston resident and member of First United Methodist Church at 516 Church Street, writing to oppose the granting of a Special Use allowance for 1621-31 for the following reasons:

- allowance for 1621-31 for the following reasons:
- 1. To avoid curb cuts and interfere with Chicago Ave bike lanes, the developer proposes parking garage and loading dock access from the alley immediately east of Chicago Avenue. This alley is already overcongested, and exit traffic from the church and onsite preschool is often blocked for long periods of time. Addition of more traffic, not to mention construction of the building, will result in even more unacceptable congestion and safety hazards to the preschool children and families. The developer has offered upgrades to the alley, but these upgrades will do nothing to reduce blockages.
- 2. The building is grossly out of size compared to current City Code 6-11-5-4, including almost twice as many units as permitted by Code (100 not including bonus compared to 54 according to Code). In addition, the building height of 145 feet is 43% higher than the 105 feet permitted for a

D4 Transition District. This gross violation would make the D4 District for this area meaningless.

- 3. A 15-story building would also be out of scale with neighboring buildings, which are 8 and 9 stories tall. In order to grant a Special Use, the Land Use Commission would be required to determine that: "Each planned development shall be compatible with surrounding development and not be of such a nature in height, bulk, or scale as to exercise any influence contrary to the purpose and intent of the Zoning Ordinance as set forth in §6-1-2". This is clearly not the case for 1621-31 Chicago Avenue.
- 4. A building of this size on this block is inconsistent with the Plan for Downtown Evanston and the Comprehensive General Plan. A Special Use of this magnitude would significantly invalidate the power of these plans by setting precedent for future developments.
- 5. The developer is offering fewer than half the required parking spaces (57 compared to 118 required). Even though the development is near public transit, this significant deficit would set a detrimental precedent for other future developments in the area.
- 6. It is my understanding that that this development has been brought before Evanston Commissions on several occasions and rejected multiple times, or avoided final rejection through continuance requests. These repeated requests for review with only peripheral concessions to the design (which in some cases worsened problems) appear to be wasting the time of City Staff, Commissions, and neighbors, who must continue to repeat review and comment efforts. It is time to send a message that a Special Use for anything resembling this proposal is not in the cards.



Unfortunately, after reviewing this with the Law Department, this cannot be considered a petition per the Land Use Commission Rules & Procedures, Article VIII, Section 4 (pages 11 and 12). We can certainly attach it as a public comment, but what you sent over doesn't have a header or anything describing what the list of people have "signed"-- it just is a list with names, their general address (no street address) and the date they signed. I would also note that only 7 of the signatures technically apply to the current application, 22PLND-0102, as the others "signed" for prior applications for the development of the 1621-31 Chicago Ave property. Feel free to make these edits if you would like, otherwise I will attach the PDF you provided in your 11:30 am email in conjunction with your public comment.

To submit a petition as described in the cited provision of the LUC rules in favor or against any application, it needs to be filed in the format described, with the information of each signee and the application about which they are signing. Also, the last sentence states, "No petition will be admitted into evidence unless the submitter certifies that he/she/they collected all signatures on the petition and that each person signing the petition did so in the presence of the person submitting the petition." The list you sent was prepared on an online platform, so it doesn't fulfill this requirement.

Please let me know if you have any questions about the above, I am happy to clarify so you are able to provide the documentation that you feel will be most effective to the LUC as part of their review! Best,

Good morning.

I do not believe any changes were made to the petition requirements for the Land Use Commission during the COVID-19 Pandemic.

A petition per the Land Use Commission Rules & Procedures, Article VIII, Section 4 (pages 11 and 12) states, "A petition favoring or opposing a proposal may be submitted. Such a petition should contain only a brief statement of the position of the persons favoring or opposing the proposal, their printed names, address, signatures, and whether each name listed holds a legal interest within the notice boundary area (when applicable). No petition will be admitted into evidence unless the submitter certifies that he/she/they collected all signatures on the petition and that each person signing the petition did so in the presence of the person submitting the petition."

It should be noted that per the City Code a need for a 2/3 vote by the City Council only applies when a petition is received for a unique use or a map amendment application, not for a planned development.
