

How often do you visit Larimer Park?




How do you typically spend your time at Larimer Park?

















Record of comments received from the project website

Response #1

I am unable to attend the meeting tomorrow although I am very interested to learn what will be done in the park as I live very close. I would like to see a lot more tree's planted there & other landscaping with additional benches. Adding bird feeders or other elements that attract birds & butterflies would be great!

Response #2

I attended the open house last night, and it occurred to me afterward that the YMCA day care and summer camps are frequent users of Larimer Park, as are other summer kids' programs. (I'm sure if the notification had been posted in the summer, it would have reached them and others who only come in warmer weather.) The folks looking for input may want to reach out to the YMCA for their input, too.

Response #3

This is a great little neighborhood park! My daughter is 2.5 and we've been coming here since she could first walk to use the playground. I would love to see the accessibility improved (remove woodchips, create a path from the sidewalk to all of the play spaces so folks with walkers/wheelchairs/strollers/etc don't have to go through the grass) and it would be AMAZING to have a bathroom. I would much rather these improvements than anything fancy design-wise.

Response #4

Plant more native perennials, native shrubs and trees, especially pollinator and bird friendly. Remove non native shrubs if they are invasive. Northeast section would be most suitable area. Consider replacing turf grass with no mow or moderate traffic groundcover in NE area.

Install new, secure fencing around park adjoining alleys and Crain since playground and "ball field" is used by children and dog play area. Could also plant native border garden along fence.

Response #5

I own a home on the same block as Larimer Park and my daughter and her friends play there frequently. We are very excited for it to be renovated and look forward to participating in the planning process to the extent that we can. We were unable to attend the first public meeting and would like to offer some wish list items as the design team contemplates how to improve the space.

First, the park is utilized largely by dog owners and kids. It would be wonderful if there could be a clear distinction where each group can feel safe and at ease. Many dogs are let off leash in the big field but often that play makes its way towards the playground. Having a clear area for dogs and a clear area for kids would improve the overall safety of the park.

Secondly, I assume some sort of play area for kids is in the plans. We would love to see a nature inspired park in place of a traditional playground. Evanston does not currently have a nature park, so I think it could be a great resource to add to our community. If this type of park does not seem feasible, we love the play area at McCulloch Park and think that could be a great model to draw from.

In any case, we are excited to see the park improved and hope to volunteer to help should there be an opportunity.

Response #6

Hello...first of all..Thank you! We appreciate you improving Larimer Park. We would love a community garden in the corner where neighbors could reserve a plot of land and garden and grow their own veggies. It would need to be in the sun..not in the shade.
