







Option: Dark Painted Wood with Panels Removed to create Open Air Structure






Curbed Planters with Trees





Sentiment Summary | Larimer Park




Airy - Solid

Sentiment Summary | Larimer Park




Subtle - Bold

Online Feedback

Record of comments received from the project website

Online Comment #01:

A track around the park that people could run or walk on and kids could bicycle on. It could be marked off with meters and yards... have a little stop sign at the sidewalk...

Online Comment #02:

Concept A (which emphasizes connection with nature) is the best of the 3 alternatives (and Concept B, with its emphasis on active recreation, is the least appropriate for this location). We need access to nearby nature, including shade trees, in and near downtown Evanston. We live 3 blocks away.

It's also in keeping with CARP to minimize lawn and the need for turf care.


It's not clear what the bollards would be protecting, but they might be preferable to a poorly maintained hedge. If a repaired stone wall is an alternative, that might be more attractive, but maintenance seems to be a challenge in this park, so simplicity seems like a good idea.

In that spirit, an open air, simple wooden shelter seems most appropriate for the location.

Planters for trees or other plantings should be below grade to help manage stormwater. See Hey & Associates guidelines from several years ago.

If rain gardens are a possibility, community volunteers have demonstrated that they are capable of and willing to monitor and even maintain plantings (examples are the Civic Center Habitat Garden and rain gardens in Ingraham Park).

In general I'd be on the side of "subtle," "airy," and "fixed." I like the "traditional" look in the lakefront building and think it would blend in with nearby buildings, but am not sure how it would work in this more secluded park.
