DECLARATION OF QUORUM

With a quorum present, Murphy Monroe called the meeting to order at 3:00pm.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Jim Johnson motioned to approve the June 22 minutes. The group agreed to approve the May 25 minutes as well.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

An inquiry was made about a need for resources for agencies/people that assist
with training assistance animals, examples were shared related to safety and the
need for a well-trained assistance animal. Suggestions were made by the
Committee.

STAFF REPORTS

Manager Ruiz reported:

- "Inquiries" and "grievances" will be two separate categories to label communication from community members
- These label options will be included on the City's new "Inquiry/Grievance Form"

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

 Parking spaces on Howard Street that limit ability of bus to pull up to the curb: still waiting for CTA approval of changes.

NEW BUSINESS

- New grievances: beach accessibility for individuals with visual impairments. An
 individual expressed concerns related to stress involved with beach visits related
 to objects hitting her in the head. Initial meeting with Manager Ruiz has taken
 place.
 - It was shared that Egyptian City has created a beach space dedicated to providing accessibility for individuals with visual impairments (tactile divider in place)
- New inquiries: suggestions for Levy Senior Center improvements needed for individuals with visual impairments such as labeling weights, providing small adapted equipment for ongoing social programs, making public aware of accommodation procedures. Initial meeting with Manager Ruiz has taken place.
- ADA/Disability Services webpages continuing to be updated (accommodation requests, inquiry/grievance form, contact info)
- Lara Biggs (Capital Planning & Engineering Bureau Chief) provided a presentation about the City's Sidewalk Improvement Plan
 - Sidewalks are critical to key City initiatives
 - Engineering team developed a new improvement program, in place since 2022. Focus on high priority areas first: schools, medical facilities/ pharmacies, transit
 - Streets Division: evaluates and applies patches when City receives concerns/complaints via 311
 - ADA Transition Plan: Sidewalk Improvement Program is referenced and meets requirements for the ADA Transition Plan.
 - If an individual with a disability cannot navigate sidewalk: complete ADA service request, will get passed along to Engineering/Streets Division, will be patched, if possible, location will be elevated in the sidewalk plan depending on timing
 - A question was asked about audible traffic signals. The City is starting to install these.
 - A question was asked about how the Committee can help increase the budget for the Sidewalk Improvement Program. Make statements, letters to City Council during budget time. City Council has been very supportive of the plan.

- The Committee approved the goals and work plan presented by Manager Ruiz
 - A suggestion was made to invite members of City Council, City staff to meetings
 - Suggestions were made to measure effectiveness of the goals: attendance at meetings, number of grievances, number of compliments, survey/questionnaires
