RTA Reflects on First Anniversary of Transit is the Answer Campaign

The Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) recently marked the one-year anniversary of its <u>Transit is the Answer campaign</u>, the regional transit system strategic plan. To further the plan's agenda of advocacy and action, RTA formed the Transit is the Answer Coalition, bringing together groups that recognize the value transit brings to the Chicago region. Coalition initiatives to date include the <u>Access Pilot Program</u>, developed with Metra and Cook County and a Regional Transit Economic Impact Analysis that will quantify the economic and climate impacts of two scenarios: a significantly reduced regional system that remains absent a sustainable funding solution; and, a transformed system with investment beyond the projected shortfall. In addition, the RTA continues to <u>invest in and support</u> communities' efforts around transit stations and stops.
