#### IML Issues Arbitration Outcome Study

This week, the Illinois Municipal League (IML) issued a report entitled: "Arbitration Involving Municipal Employers in Illinois: A Study of Outcomes". The study of appealed arbitration outcomes filed between January 1, 2019 and June 30, 2023, "exposes the uneven frequency at which municipal employees receive favorable decisions over municipal employers." These decisions "can result in costly compensation awards funded by taxpayer dollars and limited municipal authority to address personnel matters." Authored by IML Research Coordinator Madison Ratliff, the study showed that, in 360 cases involving municipal employers, employees either prevailed or were favored in the amounts awarded by arbitrators seventy percent of the time. The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) has opened nearly \$2.5 billion in competitive grant funding through the Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvement (CRISI) program.
