Ordinance 78-O-24 will levy the annual property tax for General Operations, the Human Services Fund, the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund (IMRF), Police and Fire Pension Funds, and the Solid Waste Fund totaling \$34,912,720 as extended (including a 2.50% loss factor).
