Local Reparations Not Reparations?

- Reparations are any resources, no matter how large or small, no matter how narrow or broadly administered that is targeted toward repair or healing of current injuries from past harms .
- Any initiative specifically formed to address enslavement, Jim Crow or post-Jim Crow harms to the Black community.
- A DNA test is a form of reparations.

Foundation For Local Reparations

- 3 Minimum Guidelines NAARC
- Initiatives must be determined by the injured
- Resources must be administered or approved by the injured
- Policy must be specifically targeted to address past harms
